MAYOR'S MESSAGE -

www.ci.north-logan.ut.us

Green Canyon is a special place. It is a recreational area that is unmatched. We take great pride in maintaining it in partnership with the U.S. Forest Service.

People come from all over the valley in all seasons. It is used for all kinds of activities such as hiking, biking, climbing, overnight camping and picnics. During the winter, it is the most popular cross country skiing place in Cache Valley.

In 2006, the city acquired 19.5 acres located at the entrance of Green Canyon. In 2007 it was dedicated as King Nature Park. The lower portion of the park is covered with junipers and wild grasses and is now a popular place to picnic and walk on the trail which loops around the park and connects with the Bonneville trail. The land rises steeply to the north where a moderately challenging hiking trail runs up the crest of the mountain and beyond. Last year a picnic table and benches were put in on the mountain trail. It provides a welcome rest spot and offers a spectacular view of the valley. More picnic tables and benches were also placed throughout the park.

When the land was acquired for King Park, the master plan called for the construction of a trail, pond, rest room facility, and covered pavilion. Here is what has been accomplished:

A large pond has recently been completed and will soon be stocked with trout, bass and blue gills. Residents may fish (catch/release) without a license. The area around the pond is being planted in native trees and grasses. Near the entrance to the park an all-season rest room with drinking fountains will also be available for use soon. This fall, a 45'x 30' covered pavilion will be constructed just east of the parking area near the pond. It will have an area for outdoor cooking and will be able to accommodate large family gatherings.

The original parking area has just been expanded and now can accommodate additional vehicles and those with horse trailers. You will see that some places in the park had to be disturbed to install various underground lines. Once these areas are re-vegetated with native seed mixes the area should return to a more natural look.

I've spoken to residents who aren't familiar with our newest park. If you haven't been there, I guarantee that when you see it and walk along the trails, through the junipers, you will be struck by the beauty and what has been done to make this your very special place. King Park is unlike any place in Cache Valley. It's our treasure.

Speaking of trails: We will be dedicating "Stroud Trail" on July 24th at 9:00am. The trail begins at the corner of 1200 E. & 2300 N. It is 400 feet in length and links directly to Elk Ridge Park.

I want to again recognize the hard work of community volunteers, scouts and especially those of Wal-Mart who provided thousands of dollars in helping to fund our park program and countless hours by volunteers who helped to build trails and assisted in providing improvements within King Park, Elkridge, Meadow View and other areas. There is more work to be done, so if you want to get involved in a park or trail service project, please let us know.

UPCOMING NORTH LOGAN CITY ELECTION

If you are interested in serving your community as an elected official now is the time to act. Municipal candidates will file a declaration of candidacy in person, with the Election Official: Scott Bennett, City Recorder (435) 752-1310 ext 22.

OPEN OFFICES: Mayor, 4-year term (2010-2014); City Council (2 seats), 4-year term (2010-2014) CANDIDATE FILING DATES: <u>July 1 through July 15, 2009</u>, Monday through Friday with the exception of Friday, July 3, during which the City Offices will be closed for the holiday. Time: 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., regular office hours

CANDIDATE QUALIFICATIONS: Candidates must be a United States citizen at the time of filing for candidacy; Candidates must be at least 18 years of age at the time of the next municipal election; Candidates must be a registered voter of the municipality; Candidates must be a legal resident of the municipality, or a resident of the recent annexed area, for 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the date of the election.

Pursuant to Utah Constitution Article IV, Section 6, any mentally incompetent person, any person convicted of a felony, or any person convicted of treason or a crime against the elective franchise may not hold office in this state until the right to vote or hold elective office is restored as provided by statute.

CANDIDATE FORMS/PACKET: Available July 1, 2009 through July 15, 2009 at the North Logan City Offices, 2076 North 1200 East.

A candidate declaration form and packet of election information are available to interested Mayoral or City Council candidates during the candidate filing dates. The packet may be taken for review prior to filing for candidacy, or reviewed in office. At the time of filing, the Election Official will meet with the candidate to go over election requirements and information, and answer any questions.

Now signing up for September CERT Class: The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills. Through training, citizens can manage utilities and put out small fires; treat the three killers by opening airways, controlling bleeding, and treating for shock; provide basic medical aid; search for and rescue victims safely; and organize themselves and spontaneous volunteers to be effective.

The CERT course will benefit any citizen who takes it. This individual will be better prepared to respond to and cope with the aftermath of a disaster. Additionally, North Logan City wants to supplement its response capability after a disaster, with civilians trained through CERT to function as volunteer auxiliary responders. CERT neighborhood groups can provide immediate assistance to victims in their area, organize spontaneous volunteers who have not had the training, and collect disaster intelligence that will assist professional responders with prioritization and allocation of resources following a disaster.


