## **What's Happening in City Council?**

The City Council meetings for the month of January will be on the 6<sup>th</sup> and the 20<sup>th</sup>. As of the date of preparing this newsletter the items on the agenda for January 6<sup>th</sup> are those related to starting up the New Year. The council will re-establish the day and time for its regular meetings and will take a look at various fees the city charges and adjust them if needed. The council will also consider the appointment of a person to fill the vacancy on the council as Lloyd Berentzen becomes the Mayor.

The main issue to be on the agenda for January 20<sup>th</sup> will be the monthly financial status report for the city and a preliminary look at a possible budget revision to be done in February. As the council looks at the actual revenue received and match it to the city's budget plan they can make what adjustments are needed as we go into the second half of the fiscal year.

Look for the official council agendas as they are posted at the city offices and the library. The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

## CERT INFORMATION

We want to congratulate all those who attended our Fall 2009 CERT educational course in North Logan. The two-month experience provided emergency response training in a variety of areas, and included both classroom and practical exercises. The final exercise in November was passed by 22 residents, who are now certified CERT members and able to respond to calls for help in our community. They deserve much credit for completing the course.

We extend profound thanks to our instructors, students, North Park Elementary School, disaster volunteers, and the City of North Logan for making this training a success. We intend to offer a similar opportunity again in September 2010.

## Temporary Census Jobs

Temporary Census Workers are needed for both Cache and Rich counties. You will take surveys to residences, update data, follow-up survey work and related duties as needed. There are openings for Census Takers, Crew Leaders, Crew Leader Assistants, Recruiting Assistants, and Census Clerks. These are temporary jobs and the work is part-time to full-time, evening, weekend and daytime work. Start dates are staggered from March through May, 2010. Duration will vary depending on work available. Most jobs will finish by July, 2010. Pay is from \$9.25 to \$13.00 per hour. Must have good communication skills, a valid driver's license, and have your own transportation. In addition to English, other languages would be helpful.
