MAYOR'S MESSAGE:

From the time that Ralph Smith built the first home in North Logan (2160 N. 1800 E.) until the present day, North Logan boasts a rich and wonderful history. Ralph Smith built his home in North Logan out of rock hauled from Green Canyon. He did it at a cost of \$1000. Proportionately, this was a great deal of money at the time.

Along with Ralph Smith, there were other pioneer residents such as Olif Cronquist, John Ormond, Carl Nyman, Carl M. Nelson, Aaron Darling, Emer Crockett, Jacob Wilhelm, and William Palmer. These individuals had the foresight to plant trees along road sides, build homes and farms which brought a lot of charm and identity to North Logan. There was much sacrifice and hardship by those who have gone before us that indebts us to furthering the quality of life which we have been gifted by living in this community.

On December 1, 2009 Edith Nyman Gunnell passed away. She was born in North Logan on July 12, 1921. As a life long resident and community member of North Logan, she possessed great institutional knowledge and understanding of our community. In fact her mother, Lydia Thurston Nyman, kept important historical notes about North Logan that remind us of our heritage and contribute so much to future directions.

There are others like Edith and her mother Lydia who still live among us with knowledge and understanding that is extremely valuable and should not be lost or forgotten. For this reason, I want to organize a new committee called the North Logan Historical Committee. The committee membership will be open to any of our senior citizens who have been here a long time, if not lifetime residents of North Logan. As we meet with these individuals, I hope we can extract information that will not only help us in planning for our future but also contribute to documenting valuable history. There are several other contributing committees organized within our city such as Parks and Recreation, Fire, Law Enforcement, Economic Development and Library. There have been some who have expressed interest in serving on these committees. We will try and rotate our membership of these committees in order to get as many involved as possible. We appreciate so much those who have diligently served on these committees, including some who have served for many years.

Next month, I hope to introduce a way of gaining greater insight into unique areas of our city by organizing and holding neighborhood meetings. The greater our understanding is of your desires and needs, the better we can serve you as elected officials.

Place your cans out the next day for collection unless the holiday falls on a Friday, makeup days will be announced: our webpage, radio, HJ newspaper. Marked holidays are for collection purposes only and may not apply to actual holiday dates.

*Extra holiday pick-up marked.

Environmental offices may be closed on unmarked holidays even if collections services are open, such as the observance of Dec 25 on Dec 24.

ITEMS ACCEPTED IN PROGRAM:

Please rinse all containers and remove lids

Cardboard/Paperboard



Newspaper, Mixed Paper, Magazines, Books & Catalogs



Please cut down big boxes/ Bag shredded paper



Aluminum Cans Tin/Steel Cans Any Small metal



Any Plastic (except bags & Styrofoam)

(must have symbol #1-#7)



Cell Phones & Ink Jet Cartridges

Please place in zip lock bags



EXAMPLE ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED:

Glass, plastic bags, pet food bags, potato chip bags, pizza boxes, plastic containers without the recycling symbol, plastic lids, hazardous waste, or containers that once held motor oil, yard waste, paper plates, napkins, tissues, diapers, waxy milk cartons, Styrofoam, computer equip.

Dog & Cat Licensing

REMEMBER, North Logan City has changed some of its licensing requirements regarding dogs and cats.



“Renew your pet’s license on the same day as you get their rabies vaccination.” How simple is that?

Your pet’s license is good until the rabies vaccination expires, provided you licensed your pet in 2009. If you did not license your pet in 2009, please do so as soon as possible by bringing in the veterinary certification showing the expiration date of the rabies vaccination and whether your pet is spayed or neutered. Your new license will expire at the time the rabies vaccination expires.

This ordinance does **NOT** change the Kennel Licensing ordinance.

If you have a Conditional Use permit for a Kennel License, you must re-license **EACH YEAR** by the end of February, to keep the Conditional Use Permit in effect.

What's Happening in City Council?

The City Council meetings for the month of February will be on the 3rd and the 17th. Note that council meetings in **2010 start at 6:30 p.m.** rather than 6:00 p.m..

As of the date of preparing this newsletter there were three items on the agenda for February 3rd. There are two public hearings scheduled for that meeting. The first, at 6:45, will be a hearing on a proposed budget revision. As the council looks at the actual revenue received and matches it to the city's budget plan they make what adjustments are needed as we go into the second half of the fiscal year. The second public hearing will be to receive public input on a proposed ordinance making changes to the Permitted and Conditional Uses in the Zoning Matrix. The suggested changes would allow additional compatible uses in the commercial/industrial zones (multi-family housing as an example). There are also suggested changes to the accessory dwelling conditional use to allow detached units and better code language clarifying height of buildings, accessory dwellings and setbacks for these.

The third item on the agenda for February 3rd will be a presentation to the council about the construction of stormwater retention areas within the Canyon Gates Subdivision and the extensive gravel removal from that area. The purpose of the presentation is to help the new city council members learn about the extent of the previously approved gravel removal operation in the mouth of Green Canyon.

The only issue on the agenda for February 20th at the time this newsletter was written is the monthly financial status report. Look for the official council agendas as they are posted at the city offices and the library. The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

Mayor Lloyd Berentzen and City Council members Nancy Potter and John Bailey were sworn into office on January 4, 2010. The Council's first item of business during the January 6th meeting was to fill the vacancy left by Lloyd Berentzen's becoming mayor. Allen Kartchner was appointed to fill the two-year vacancy.
