MAYOR'S MESSAGE:

A lot seems to be happening in the city these days. By the time you read this newsletter we will have enjoyed our 24th of July celebration along with all of the other activities we participate in this time of year. Because of the late and continued moisture it seems that summer is moving along very quickly.

I wanted to take some of this newsletter and update everyone about a few things that I believe will be of interest.

- We are in the process of completing an asphalt trail that will run along 19th North from about 16th East and connect into the Bonneville Shoreline Trail by the power substations. This will provide a more safe walking and bike access to the King Nature Park and Green Canyon. Rocky Mountain Power donated \$25,000 towards the completion of this trail.
- 16th East between 27th and 31st North has now been re-graded and re-surfaced and should provide for a safer and more desirable road to travel on.
- As many of you know, Green Canyon had a considerable amount of water coming out of it because of the excess snowpack this year. Because of the work of our streets and utilities crews, we were able to avert significant flooding by creating three separate retaining and settling ponds strategically placed one behind the other from east to west to capture additional waters as each would fill up. I want to thank those who worked so hard and so quickly to respond to the tremendous surges of water.
- One of the most exciting recent events is the acquisition of over twelve acres to expand Elk Ridge Park to the South. This has been in discussions for years but now has become a reality. This will be a great addition and will serve as additional space for community gatherings, families and friends.

One additional item that I would like to mention is our green waste bins located just west of Elk Ridge Park. We are having tremendous difficulty maintaining it in a way that will allow us to continue the privilege of having it there. There are apparently commercial users and perhaps some others who are simply dumping around it or not following the rules that allow us to have it here in the city. Please help us maintain this to a standard that will allow us to continue this free service. If you notice anyone not following the rules, please call Dispatch at 435-753-7555 immediately.

What's Happening in City Council?

The City Council meetings for the month of August will be on the 3rd and the 17th starting at 6:30 pm.

As of the date of preparing this newsletter there are no specific items on the agendas for August. There are, however, a variety of items that will likely be discussed in August's meetings but no specific date has been set for them.

There are several developers seeking approval for projects in and around the planned North Logan City Center (2000 to 2200 North and 200 to 400 East). The council will be considering these projects as their plans become more certain. One project to be considered will be the development plan for a mixed-use multi-family complex including a combination reception room, clubhouse, and business office center in the Mixed-Use General zone located on the south side of 2200 North between 50 and 200 East. This project has had conceptual plan approval and will be seeking final approval, most likely sometime in August.

Look for the official council agendas as they are posted at the city offices, on the city website at www.northlogancity.org and at the library. The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

Help Prevent Water Pollution

We all can help prevent water pollution. Governments have laws that cover pollution by industry, but many of the things people do every day contribute to the problem.

Tips:

Learn about the flow of water. Water from households goes into sewage systems and then into treatment facilities in most communities, where many pollutants are removed. Water we use outside the house, such as in the garden, goes into storm sewer systems, irrigation canals and then into rivers, lakes and streams.

Examine your habits. Use of pesticides means that when it rains on the lawn or garden, chemicals wash into the storm sewers.

Pick up pet waste. This is also a form of water pollution we can prevent.

Remember, polluting the land means polluting the water. Throwing away trash on the ground near a grating means it eventually reaches a body of water.

Watch disposal of household products such as paint and solvents. These chemicals also cause water pollution when you do not dispose of them properly. Use hazardous waste disposal sites.

Set up a composter. This is a great way to reduce your weekly garbage, dispose of yard clippings and make a wonderful rich organic product for garden soil.

The purpose for the run is to raise funds for scholarships for students attending Utah State University. LCpl Allred had hoped to attend USU when he finished his enlistment with the Marines. He also loved motorcycles and dreamed of coming home and going on long road trips. His family has created the scholarship foundation to honor his memory and also as a means of expressing their deepest, heart-felt gratitude to the community that so graciously supported them in their time of trial. Note from Logan ENVIRONMENTAL DEPARTMENT Overfilling Cans and Dumpsters

Logan City Environmental Department asks that residents please refrain from overfilling garbage cans, green waste cans, recycle cans, and commercial dumpsters. A container is considered overfull if the lid will not close completely. Overfilling containers make it difficult for waste collection professionals to empty the cans and increases the likelihood that garbage, recycling, and green waste will spill from the containers onto the ground. Overfilling cans also cause the container to be too heavy for our trucks to lift. If you have extra garbage, **we can help!** Call our office at 435-716-9755 to learn about pricing for extra curbside garbage, recycling, and green waste empties. Excess garbage can also be taken to the landfill for a fee. Recycling and green waste are accepted at the landfill, **1400 W 200 N**, at **NO CHARGE! ***Note from our Parks & Recreation Department: Please remember that the green waste dumpsters south of Elk Ridge Park are free for North Logan residents **ONLY. No commercial businesses are authorized to use the green waste dumpsters.** If you see commercial businesses dumping green waste, or individuals overfilling or dumping green waste on the ground, please call 435-753-7555 and report the incident.

Logan City Environmental Department would like the public to be aware that as of August 1, 2011, all glass recycling bins will be removed from the recycling drop sites throughout Cache County. Due to high contamination rates, our glass recycler will no longer accept the glass from our drop sites. Please remember that glass **MUST NOT** be placed in your blue curbside recycling container. Glass can be recycled at Utah State University's recycling center (435-797-2011) or disposed of in your regular garbage container (black can or tan dumpster). We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause and remind the public that it is important to make sure that your waste is put in the correct containers.
