## **MAYOR'S MESSAGE: Is North Logan a great town, or what? (written by North Logan's Community Development Director, Cordell Batt)**

It is always nice to see that the place you have picked to live is doing well compared to other places in the country. Most of you probably read the front page article in the Herald Journal where North Logan is one of five Utah Cities to make CNN Money Magazine's "Best Places to Live" in 2011 coming in at No. 63.

The article quoted that North Logan is said to be a rural alternative to Logan, sitting "in a valley surrounded by mountains, giving it a slightly isolated feel. Agriculture--dairy, in particular--is big around here, though Utah State University is the town's largest employer." I know that many come to live in the valley despite the lower than average income, because of the other overwhelming attributes that the valley and especially North Logan has to offer.

Quoting the article again, "Many come to North Logan for serious acreage." I'm not sure that 'serious acreage' is the term I would have used, but I know that when you talk to those of us who live here, it is important that North Logan still has those rural feeling streets and open fields throughout the community. Also important is that you still feel very safe living in North Logan. I have found myself many times driving away from my home thinking that I forgot to lock the front door and not being too worried about, but knowing that if it would have been in some of the other places I have lived, I would have turned around immediately and gone back to lock up.

If you go to the website ([cnn.com/magazines/moneymag/bplive/2011/top100](http://cnn.com/magazines/moneymag/bplive/2011/top100)) it states "there is not much of a downtown yet, but it is a short drive to shopping centers in the area". As many of you know, we as a City have been working on changing that, with many years of planning and designing of a City Center for North Logan. We have recently had many interested in and looking at this area. In fact, the first major housing project will soon begin construction, which will be a major support feature for the future businesses that we hope to attract to the area.

For those of you that may not know where this area is, just drive to our new round-a-bout on 1800 North and look north and slightly east to 2200 North and notice all the undeveloped land that is still available to develop. This is North Logan's future City Center (Downtown) area.

### **What's Happening in City Council?**

The City Council meetings for the month of September will be on the 7<sup>th</sup> and the 21<sup>st</sup> starting at 6:30 pm.

As of the date of preparing this newsletter there is only one item on either of the agendas for September. On September 7<sup>th</sup> some of the candidates for City Council will be given the opportunity to introduce themselves to those present at the council meeting and explain a little about their candidacy.

Look for the official council agendas as they are posted at the city offices, at the library, and on the city website ([www.northlogancity.org](http://www.northlogancity.org)). The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

### **Pollution Prevention in Outdoor Construction and Remodeling**

Construction and remodeling projects present special issues in stormwater control and pollution prevention. Heavy rains could easily transfer exposed sediment to local waterways. Exposed soils and the addition of impervious building materials will likely contribute to excessive runoff and erosion problems. Fiber rolls or silt fence materials can be used to protect overturned soil prone to erosion during the construction process. Stacked bags of gravel or sand around storm drains will absorb eroded sediments while letting water pass through. Temporary seeding can be used to stabilize soils in areas that will be exposed for longer periods. Take care during any construction and remodeling projects around your home to be on the lookout for potential stormwater pollution problems.

**Whether You Are New in Town, or a Long-Term Resident, Pet Licenses Are Due at the time of the Rabies vaccination**

We hope everyone is aware that all dogs and cats (except field cats) are required to be vaccinated for rabies; and licensed at the city office within 30-days of the vaccination and each updated vaccination thereafter. The fees are as follows:  
 Neutered/Spayed Dog = \$10 Dog = \$20 Neutered/Spayed Cat = \$5 Cat = \$10  
 If licensing after 30-days of the vaccination, the license fees will increase by fifty percent (50%).  
 Certification of Rabies and documentation of spay or neuter must be provided at the time of licensing.  
 Notice: Only two dogs/four cats are allowed on residential property zoned less than one acre. Properties of more than one acre and appropriately zones, may apply for a *Conditional Use Permit* to have more than two dogs/four cats. Application for a *Conditional Use Permit* is \$175.00 (one-time fee only). If authorized, a \$50 kennel license fee is paid. The kennel license is effective from January to December and must be renewed (\$50 payment) each year.

**FROM THE CHIEF**

School is back in session and with it comes more children on bikes and sidewalks. As you are traveling in the mornings and afternoons in the areas of our schools watch for our crossing guards. Remember that when the crossing guard steps out into the intersection you should stop. The crossing guard will maintain their position in the cross walk until all the children have stepped up on the opposite curb. The crossing guard will then return to their position on the sidewalk and you can then proceed. Avoid using your cell phone so you can focus on driving.  
 We are in need of some substitute crossing guards. If you are interested pick up an application at the North Park Police Department or at North Park, Greenville Elementary and Thomas Edison Charter School North.

**SIDEWALKS AND TREES** In many areas of the City, shrubbery and trees are encroaching on the sidewalks. If the sidewalks adjacent to your property have this problem, it is your responsibility to keep them trimmed. Shrubby should be trimmed back one foot behind the sidewalk and there should be at least seven feet of clearance above the sidewalk. If there are trees hanging over the street they should be trimmed back to the inside of the curb. On streets without curbs, back to the edge of the asphalt and up to a height of 12 feet. This is to protect the flashing lights and exhaust stacks on our fire trucks, snow plow trucks, and garbage trucks. Thank you from the Streets Dept.
