## MAYOR'S MESSAGE:

On August 16th, 2011, Irma Krebs of North Logan passed away from unexpected heart problems. On August 30th, Michael Scott Winn of North Logan, also passed away as a result of a tragic automobile accident. Even more recently on September 7th, at the age of 36, Marcia Cheney, our North Logan Library Director also passed away as a result of a sudden illness. Each of these individuals will be missed greatly and our thoughts and prayers go out to all of their families.

As I had a chance to read the obituaries and eulogies of those who had left words of comfort, I paid particular attention to the descriptors of each of these individuals. For example, Irma Krebs was described as positive, giving, and enthusiastic. Michael (Scott) Winn was said to have a quick smile, sense of humor, and willing to help. It was mentioned that Marcia Cheney had characteristics of being quiet, gentle, and kind.

One comment that I paid particular attention to was a phrase that could be applied to all of those who have passed on and have been such a significant part of our lives here in North Logan. It was, "may we find comfort in their memories". As I thought about these 7 words I could not help but reflect on so many who have gone before us in our community of North Logan. It is their memories and their contributions that have made our city such a wonderful place to call home. From the time the first home was built in North Logan until today, it is the culmination of all of their lives, the work they have done and the decisions they have made, which benefits all of us today in enjoying the quality of life the we have.

I have great confidence that our future can continue to inspire wonderful outcomes if we take time to reflect on the legacy and wisdom that has been given to us from previous generations. Perhaps our greatest potential tragedy is to be less than we are capable of being.

Recently we had our primary election for 3 future council positions which will be vacated at the 1st of the year. Even though North Logan was recognized as having the best turnout at the polls, it was still less than 1 in 5 registered voters. It has been refreshing to see so many great candidates sign up to run for these positions. I hope that when we go to the polls in November, we will take seriously our right and opportunity to vote. I want to challenge the 4 out of 5 registered voters who were not able to make it last time to come and vote. Remember, if you cannot make it on Election Day, there is early voting available at the city offices. See below for details.

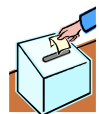

## What's Happening in City Council?

The City Council meetings for the month of October will be on the 5<sup>th</sup> and the 19<sup>th</sup> starting at 6:30 pm.

As of the date of preparing this newsletter there are only two items on the agendas for October. On October 5<sup>th</sup> there will be two public hearings. The first will be to receive public input regarding an ordinance deleting Title 12F – Flood Plain Management from the City Code. This section of the code was superseded by Ordinance 11-03 adopted by the City Council May 18, 2011. The ordinance will be considered for adoption on October 19<sup>th</sup>.

The second public hearing on October 5<sup>th</sup> will be to receive public input regarding a proposed ordinance to effect a boundary adjustment with Hyde Park. Being proposed is that a portion of the recreation land, owned by Cache County, between North Logan City and Hyde Park become part of Hyde Park City. That ordinance as well will be considered for adoption on October 19<sup>th</sup>.

Look for the official council agendas as they are posted at the city offices, on the city website ([www.northlogancity.org](http://www.northlogancity.org)) and at the library. The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

## Help Prevent Water Pollution – What About Leaves?

What gets done with the leaves you rake? Putting grass clippings, leaves, and yard debris in the street, storm drain, or ditch can cause problems for you and your water. Storm drains can clog, streets can flood, and water can become polluted. To avoid this, use clippings and leaves as fertilizer, use a mulching lawn mower, compost leaves and clippings, or bag them for yard waste collection day.

**Open Burning in North Logan City Limits**

Burn permits will be permitted October 1<sup>st</sup> until November 1<sup>st</sup>, when the Clearing index is above 500 and Air Quality Control has declared a green burn day.

- No leaves, grass clippings or rubbish will be burned.
- No wood that has been chemically treated (construction wood) will be burned.
- No paper products will be burned.
- All fires shall not be conducted within 50 feet a structure or combustible materials.
- Buckets, shovels, hoses, or a fire extinguisher with a minimum 4-A rating shall be readily available.
- All fires will be out before dark.



An adult will be with the fire at all times.

The North Logan City Fire Department shall issue permits, if the property meets all of the above requirements. For open burning or recreational burning permits, please call the "on call" Fire Duty Officer at **435-994-1530**.
