I want to thank all of those who have participated in the online survey process. It was great to get all of the feedback and we will take time to consider all of the suggestions that have been given in hopes of doing the right thing for our community as we move forward into the future.

I also appreciate the feedback and input given to us regarding our need to relocate our Law Enforcement Officials. Unfortunately we did not have significant turnouts at the information meetings held for public input. However, I have had significant feedback from many of you in less formal settings and I know that the Council Members have also had many individual conversations. I hope to encourage you to continue to give us input so that we do what is right for the citizens of North Logan.

One crucial benefit we will receive as a result of freeing up needed space at the Fire Department is that volunteers will be housed on site 24 hours a day. This will reduce emergency response time from 4 or 5 minutes to less than a minute during emergency fire and medical situations. In fact, it is our hope that the county will recognize that North Logan is the next most logical place to house ambulance service. By making space for ambulance operations in the fire department building it strengthens our quest to make this happen for the benefit of North Logan citizens and its surrounding areas. This seems like the logical next step for Cache County's Ambulance System and those who operate the county-wide ambulance service.

Again please feel free to give me your ideas and thoughts on this and other critical issues facing our city. Thank you for all you do to help make our city and neighborhoods such a great place to live.

What's Happening in City Council?

The City Council meetings for the month of May will be on the first and third Wednesdays, the 2nd and the 16th of May, starting at 6:30 pm.

As of the date of preparing this newsletter the only items on the agenda for May are those relating to preparing the budget for fiscal year 2013 which starts July 1, 2012. The agendas for the meetings in May will include workshops to discuss the entire budget since all the department budget presentations will be completed by then.

The council may also continue to discuss plans for the construction of a new police department building.

Look for the official council agendas as they are posted at the city offices and the library. The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

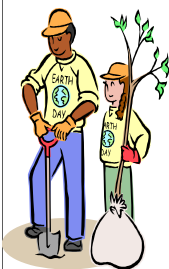


Our staff is busy checking the drainage grates in the City; however, it is difficult to know if every grate is free from debris every day. Curb and gutters should be free from dirt, rocks and debris so that the runoff can get to the drains. Help us keep the drains clean. If you find you need sandbags, EMERGENCY ONLY, please call the City at 435-752-1310 ext 10 or 11 and we will get you in contact with our public works department. FROM THE DESK OF THE CHIEF

This month I would like to highlight some concerns that our Animal Control Officer Nolan Krebs brought up the other day. First, with spring arriving we also begin see the emergence of rodents and other small mammals that can be a nuisance. If you choose to use a baited poison to help in controlling the problem, please use extra caution in distributing it. You have an obligation to use the bait in such a way as to protect other domestic animals or humans from being exposed to the poison. You should also be aware that some poisons require professional licenses to administer. If you have questions or concerns about animal nuisance problems give our animal control officer a call a 435-753-7555. He is a great resource and can help find a solution to your problem.

I also wanted to remind pet owners that if your pets get away or are lost, please call the North Park Police at 435-753-7600 or dispatch at 435-753-7555. Our Animal Control Officer Nolan Krebs works very hard to try and locate owners of found pets. Please attach collars with licenses, as required by ordinance. Many pet owners are also having microchips implanted so they can be scanned and the owner information obtained. Officer Krebs has a scanner and does scan each animal that is picked up. When licensing your pets, let us know the chip #. Remember your pets are depending on you to help keep them safe and law abiding.



The North Logan Tree Committee is partnering with Rocky Mountain Power to plant trees in May in **KING PARK** to celebrate Arbor Day 2012. We will meet at King Park (2200 E & 1900 N) on **May 17th at 1:00 p.m.** Any and all are invited to help dig dirt, plant trees and have fun doing so. 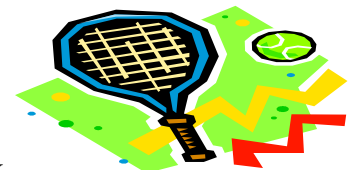

Is there a street light out on your street? Call Rocky Mountain Power at 1-877-548-3768 and press #1 for residential assistance, then press #3 for street light out. Once the operator comes on the line, give them the pole # that you are calling about. Each pole has a metal plate on it with a unique # that tells them exactly where the pole is. They will then create a work order and have the street light fixed.
