What's Happening in City Council?

The City Council meetings for the month of November will be on the 7th and the 28th starting at 6:30 pm. The meeting on the 28th will be a week later than what would have been the normally scheduled date. The council is meeting on that date due to the Thanksgiving Day holiday the week before.

During November the council will continue to discuss changes to the city code relating to the mixed-use zones and the general plan for developing the city center and areas proximate to that. They will also continue working on proposed revisions to the city's Transportation Map, especially in the city center area.

The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

No Early AM Parking on Streets after November 15th!

Consider this your warning notice...We would like to remind everyone that starting **November 15th** the winter parking ordinance (11-604) will go into effect. This means vehicles/trailers/RV's, etc., cannot be parked on city streets, curbs and shoulders between **1:00 am - 5:00 am** on any day. Please let your family and friends know, as citations will be issued during these hours. Do not put your garbage/recycling out the night before if it looks like there will be snow during the night. During other hours, if it is snowing, or beginning to snow, we would appreciate you not parking on the streets so that our snow plows can keep your roads clean and safe for you and your family. Non-Resident Library Cards-North Logan City Library has reduced the cost of non-resident library cards. The new rate is \$90.00 per household. This amount may be paid in full at the time of registration or you may choose to make 4 installments of \$24.00 each. Please remember your card is valid only through the last day of your paid subscription. If you choose the quarterly installment you will need to pay every 3 months.

Storytimes-Storytimes are Tuesdays at 10:10 am for Toddler Time (2 years and under) and at 11:00 am for 3-5 year olds. There will not be Storytimes on Tuesday, November 6th due to Elections.

Animal Control - Nolan Krebs

Did you know it is unlawful for any person to willfully kill any domestic animal belonging to another, or to administer poison to any domestic animal. [Ordinance 16.202](#)

It is unlawful for any person to engage in trapping in North Logan City except under the supervision of the Animal Control Officer. The Animal Control Officer may make available humane "live" traps to the public to trap nuisance animals running at large and trespassing on their property. In this case, the person trapping an animal will notify the Animal Control Officer who will retrieve the trap and deal with the animal in accordance with approved policies.

The trapping of wild and nuisance animals is regulated by State law. Residents are encouraged to contact Animal Control for assistance and advice regarding wild and other nuisance animals. [Ordinance 16-207](#)

COMMERCIAL & BUSINESS STORM DRAIN SYSTEM PROTECTION

- Regularly clean/sweep parking lots to prevent debris run off into storm drain system.
- Inspect and clean storm drain inlets and catch basins of any debris or garbage.
- Where applicable, install oil/water separators, chemical separators, snouts, or other appropriate filtration devices.
- Limit the amount of pesticides and herbicides applied to lawn, park strips and landscaped areas.
- Eliminate excessive use of fertilizers to landscaping. Sweep up excess fertilizer rather than hosing away.
- Verify that wash bay facilities are draining to sanitary sewer and not to storm drain.
- Cover loaded trucks to prevent items from blowing out and entering storm drain system.
- Snow removal - minimize the use of de-icing salts (alternate methods).
- Cover trash containers to prevent garbage migration via wind and/or animals to storm water system.

Regularly inspect and maintain vehicles to make sure no fluids are leaking that would pollute storm drain system.

FROM THE STREETS DEPARTMENT

The goal of the **Streets Department** is to quickly and efficiently provide safe and clear roadways as soon as possible after each snow storm. All the city streets have been categorized according to priority. Priority is based upon the volume of traffic and the number of homes or businesses serviced by that road.

The highest priority is given to arterial roads, which include routes to schools, hospitals, medical facilities, downtown areas, hills and main roads going to and from residential areas. Collector roads are the next priority and are mainly residential, local roads-including cul-de-sacs and parking lots.

Please keep in mind that the duration and intensity of storms are also a big factor regarding priorities. During major storms, only the highest priority roads will be maintained until the storm subsides and crews are able to move on to collector roads.
