What's Happening in City Council

The City Council meetings for the month of March will be on the first and third Wednesdays, March 6th and 20th. The City Council meetings start at 6:30 pm.

Staff is working on putting together the 2014 municipal budget which will be adopted in June. On March 6th, city staff members will begin to make budget presentations to the city council. On that day expect presentations from the Fire Department, Protective Inspection and Engineering, Facilities, and Community Development Departments. On March 20th, there will be budget presentations from the Parks Department, the Recreation Department, and the Cemetery Department. Other departments will make similar presentations in April and May in preparation for public hearings on the budget planned for June 5th.

The City Council and the Planning Commission will continue working on a land-use ordinance intended to make minor changes to the Mixed Use portions of the City Code after the passage of the City Center Ordinance. Some areas near parcels recently re-zoned to City Center Zones will be considered for re-zoning as well. Land owners affected by these changes were notified by letter about a public hearing with the Planning Commission held February 21st. This issue will be considered by the City Council during its March 6th meeting. The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

***** Winter Parking Restrictions *****

The winter parking ordinance that went into effect in November, **expired** on February 28th.

HOWEVER - we could still have a snowy spring, so if it looks like snow, please help the streets department do their job and **do not park on the streets.**

March 17-23 is National Poison Prevention Week—The North Logan City office has a **PRESCRIPTION DROP BOX** all year long. The drop box is inside the City Office (2076 N 1200 E) and we are open from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. Leave the pills in bottles or pour them in a plastic sealed bag. We also have a sharps container if you have used sharps and need to dispose of them. The North Park Police pick up the medication/pills and have them incinerated.

Storm Water Pollution Prevention-Take Care of Your Trash, Trash Bins, and Dumpsters

Post "No Littering" signs and enforce anti-litter laws. Provide a sufficient number of litter receptacles for your home or business. Clean out and cover litter receptacles frequently to prevent spillage.

Keep dumpster areas clean. Recycle materials whenever possible. Use all of a product before disposing of the container. Ensure that only appropriate solid wastes are added to the solid waste container. Certain wastes such as hazardous wastes, appliances, fluorescent lamps, pesticides, etc., may not be disposed of in solid waste containers. Take special care when loading or unloading wastes to minimize losses.

Inspect dumpsters and trash bins weekly for leaks and to ensure that lids are on tightly. Replace any that are leaking, corroded, or otherwise deteriorating. Sweep and clean the storage area regularly and clean up spills immediately. If the dumpster area is paved, do not hose it down to a storm drain. Instead, use dry methods when possible (e.g., sweeping, use of absorbents). Prevent storm water run-on from entering the dumpster area by enclosing it or building a berm around the area. Prevent waste materials from directly contacting rain. Cover dumpsters to prevent rain from washing waste out of holes or cracks in the bottom of trash bins or dumpsters.
