MAYOR'S MESSAGE:

As spring finally comes back to North Logan City and brings its welcome changes with it, perhaps it is time to think about the changes happening in the city. We are considering a boundary change with Logan City which would bring a net increase in acreage to the city and add some great businesses to North Logan on the west side of Main Street. The boundary being proposed would add to North Logan City's boundaries - Sonic, Harley Davidson, the building that housed Hamilton's restaurant, the corner gas station on 2500 N and Main, and several businesses on the south side of 2500 N west of Main. Logan City would gain Lynn's Audio & Video and the businesses west of them, the Hampton Inn, Kneaders, Jack's Tire & Oil, and the three buildings on the west side of Main just north of 1800 N. The change will allow other new businesses the opportunity to develop in either Logan or North Logan and not have to be concerned about having to build in two jurisdictions because of the current zigzag boundary configuration.

Another big change being proposed that would affect North Logan is a proposed high school being considered near the Eccles Ice Center. A bond election by Cache County Schools in June will determine if this change becomes a part of North Logan's future and in the meantime the school district is seeking input from the citizens through an online survey.

New folks are moving into North Logan all the time and will continue to do so as some of the recently approved projects are completed. Yes, Spring has come to North Logan, the city is changing and we as city officials hope the changes that are coming will be good for the great citizens we have as neighbors and friends. Public Notice of North Logan CITY MUNICIPAL ELECTION LEGAL NOTICE

Notice is hereby given that North Logan City will hold a Municipal General Election November 5, 2013, for the following offices:

Mayor - 4 year term, and two (2) City Council Member - 4 year term.

Persons desiring to be a candidate for the 2013 Municipal Election must file a declaration of candidacy or a nomination petition between June 3rd through June 7th, 2013, at the North Logan City Office, in person to the City Recorder, 2076 North 1200 East, North Logan, Utah during regular office hours (weekdays between 8am and 5pm).

Candidates must meet the following qualifications: 1) Be a United States citizen; 2) Be a registered voter of the City; 3) Be a resident of North Logan City for at least 365 consecutive days immediately preceding the date of the election; and, 4) Have no felony convictions, unless their right to hold elective office has been restored.

If necessary, a Primary Election will be held Tuesday, August 13, 2013. The Municipal Election will be held Tuesday, November 5, 2013. Scott Bennett, City Recorder

New County Wide Reverse 911 System

March 6th, 2013

The 911 Communications Center recently switched to **CodeRED** to provide mass notifications to Cache County communities. The CodeRed system provides the 911 center the ability to quickly deliver messages to targeted areas, or to an entire city. These messages are issued at the request of local law enforcement or fire personnel and contain emergency notifications and instructions. In addition to voice phone calls citizens can also register to receive these time-sensitive messages on their cellular or VOIP device, as well as by e-mail and/or text message.

This system is only as good as the telephone number database supporting it. Notifications are currently delivered automatically to landline phones for Qwest/Century Link customers and to cell phone customers who have recently completed the new CodeRED registration process on our website. Do not miss an EMERGENCY message! All individuals and businesses should take time to register and add contact information to include cellular phones and other non-traditional phones, as well as email and text addresses. What's Happening in City Council?

The City Council meetings for the month of April will be on the first and third Wednesdays, April 3rd and 17th. The City Council meetings start at 6:30 pm.

Staff will continue putting together the 2014 municipal budget which will be adopted in June. On April 3rd city staff members will make more budget presentations to the city council. On that day expect presentations from the Storm Water Department, the Police Department, and the Library. On April 17th there will be budget presentations from the Streets Department and the Utilities Department (the Water and Sewer funds). Also on April 17th the council will have budget discussion on personnel/benefits costs, general administration costs, the Capital Improvement Fund, and funds related to the Redevelopment Agency. In May the council will look at the entire budget and get ready to have it presented to the public in a public hearing on June 5th. The City Council will continue working on a proposed adjustment to the city's boundary with Logan City with a public hearing planned on the issue also to be held during the council's meeting on June 5th.

The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

The North Logan City office has a **PRESCRIPTION DROP BOX**...Does your medicine cabinet have outdated medication, old pills or cough syrups? The drop box is inside the City Office (2076 N 1200 E) and open from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. You can leave the pills in the bottles or pour them in a plastic sealed bag for disposal.

We are now asking that people who use sharps on a regular basis, to dispose of the sharps into an empty milk jug. When filled, take the milk jug directly to the Police Station at 42 E 2200 N, Ste C, for disposal.

A note from your water department . . .

DO NOT OPEN THE WATER METER LID to check your reading, or turn off your water. Your plumber should not open the meter barrel either. *The exception is that if you are flooding and cannot wait for help from the city, then go ahead and turn the water off but contact the city immediately.* We have had several customers lately open their meters for a variety of reasons and they have caused damage that they are being billed for. These are radios, touch pads and wires that can easily be broken. If you cover your meter lid, we may not be able to find it in an emergency and your house could sustain significant water damage before we can locate it and get it turned off. If you need your water service turned off, please contact us at 435-752-1310 extension 11 or 10 and we will get someone from the city to meet you.

It is true; the snow will soon be gone. It has been a long winter and I am sure you will agree, we are all excited for spring! It is time to check the area around your water meter. We will begin reading meters on April 12th. Please make sure your meter lid is uncovered and free from any of the following: vehicles, railroad ties, flower boxes, sprinkler boxes, dirt, bushes and grass or any other obstacles. Trim back all bushes and plants around the meter. Our meter readers are trying to get an accurate reading, and they are also looking for any problems in the meter barrel. When there is easy access to the meters, it makes it possible for them to do their job accurately. The majority of North Logan property owners are always willing to do their part to help us out. Thank you so much for your support!

Fire Hydrants are in your neighborhoods to protect your home or property in the event of a fire. Every year we have commercial trucks pull up to our hydrants and steal water. Some even break the hydrant, making it unavailable in an emergency. It is with the help of our citizens that we can get a handle on this. The city does issue special permits to companies that are authorized to use some hydrants. If you see someone using water at a hydrant in North Logan, please call Peggy at 752-1310 ext. 11, and she will be able to verify if they have a permit or catch those who do not.
