Notice is hereby given that North Logan City will hold a Municipal General Election November 5, 2013, for the following offices:

Mayor—4 year term and two (2) City Council Members—4 year terms

Persons desiring to be a candidate for the 2013 Municipal Election must file a declaration of candidacy or a nomination petition between June 3rd and June 7th, 2013 at the North Logan City Office in person to the City Recorder, 2076 North 1200 East, North Logan, Utah during regular office hours (weekdays between 8am and 5pm).

Candidates must meet the following qualifications: 1) Be a U.S. Citizen; 2) Be a registered voter of the City; 3) Be a resident of North Logan City for at least 365 consecutive days immediately preceding the date of the election; and 4) Have no felony convictions, unless their right to hold elective office has been restored. If necessary, a Primary Election will be held Tuesday, August 13, 2013. The Municipal election will be held Tuesday, November 5, 2013. Scott Bennett, City Recorder

Spring is Car Wash Time – Use Caution

Outdoor car washing has the potential to result in high loads of sediments, nutrients, metals and hydrocarbons in our storm drain system. Detergent-rich water used to wash the grime off cars flows down the street and into storm drains and canals. Commercial car wash facilities often recycle their water or are required to partially treat their wash water discharge prior to release into the sanitary sewer system. Most storm water impacts from car washing are from residents, businesses and charity car wash fundraisers that discharge polluted wash water directly into the storm drain system.

To reduce the impact of car wash run-off and to reduce discharges into storm drains, follow some of these management practices:

- Use a commercial car wash or wash your car on gravel, grass or other permeable surfaces.
- If possible, block off the storm drain during charity car wash events and divert the water onto grass or landscaping to provide filtration.
- Use hoses with nozzles that automatically turn off when left unattended and use **biodegradable** soaps.

ANNUAL CEMETERY FLOWERS AND DECORATION REMOVAL:

Two weeks after Memorial Day we will be discarding all decorations and flowers from the Cemetery that appear out of condition or that are not in compliance the City's Cemetery Ordinance. This includes shepherds hooks. This cleaning will take place semi -annually after the Memorial Day/Veterans Day holidays. Below is an excerpt from the Cemetery Ordinance. For the full ordinance please go to the City Website.

** "Glass containers (are) prohibited.....Small baskets, pots, cans, vases, toys, (flowers), decorations of any kind are acceptable as long as they remain within the 6" concrete base (mowing strip) on the north and/or south of the headstone/ monument. Shepherds hooks, pinwheels, etc., are permitted only within the places specifically provided for such in the headstone mowing strip. All decorations, vases, toys, etc., are discouraged on the east and/or west mowing strip of the headstone, as these items may need to be removed."

The Red Light


We've had some people ask about the red light on the front of the fire station. This excerpt from Fire Service Info gives some insight into the history of lights on fire stations. Why do fire stations have red lights on the front? A question often received. In truth it should probably be, "Why do some fire stations have red lights on the front? The usual reply is: "Ask the department where you see the red lights. (And let me know.)" The fact is that some do and some don't have red lights. The lights could be there for a host of reasons:

- Some communities have just chosen to have red lights to signify a fire station.
- Perhaps it guides someone to where the night doorbell is.
- Some volunteer departments use a light (sometimes red) to indicate the location of a phone to call 911. (Since these are mostly unmanned stations.)
- Some used lights to signal an alarm.
- Some indicated that the doors were about to open or close.
- There could be some local tradition.

For the North Logan station it not only identifies it as a fire station, but also symbolizes that we are always here for the community and willing to help.



Open and Agricultural Burning Permits



The DAQ rules governing open burning can be found in the Utah Administrative Code (UAC) R307-202. This rule allows open burning of: clippings, bushes, plants and pruning's from trees incident to property and residential clean-up activities, provided that the following conditions have been met:

The clearing index is 500 or greater. The clearing index is a measure of the atmospheric mixing and wind speed. A clearing index less than 500 is considered poor atmospheric conditions and a permit will not be issued.

The Utah Division of Air Quality's online Open Burn Permit Application must be completed, a valid permit number issued by the DAQ.

- To begin a burn permit application, go to www.cachecounty.org and click the "get a burn permit" link.
- An open burn permit application is required for each separate burn.
- An open burn permit is valid only on the lands specified in the permit and is required to be on site at the time of the burn.
- All materials to be burned must be clearly described and quantified in the application.
- Applicants must be aware of any and all local, state and federal rules and regulations applicable to their area. Open burning may be prohibited in some areas of the state.

If completing the open burn permit application online is not an option, the applicant may visit the fire station at 2005 North 1200 East to complete a permit application in person.

If your fire extends beyond your control you should immediately call the fire department at 911.

What's Happening in City Council?

- The City Council meetings for the month of May will be on the first and third Wednesdays, May 1st and 15th. The City Council meetings start at 6:30 pm and are held in the meeting room at the North Logan Library.
- City staff will continue putting together the 2014 municipal budget to be adopted in June. On both May 1st and 15th the Council will continue to review the city's budget. The separate departments' budget presentations have been completed and will now be combined into one comprehensive budget. The Council will be working to get a budget ready to have it presented to the public in a public hearing on June 12th. The city's website will have posted therein, the various drafts of the budget as it is developed by the council.
- Also on May 1st, the Council will conduct a public hearing to receive public input on a proposed concept plan for a combined residential and commercial development of 5.6 acres of land on the south side of 2500 North, just west of the Cinnamon Ridge mobile home park. The property is currently owned by Lewiston State Bank. The concept plan for this development includes 32 townhome units, 13 single family dwellings and two commercial lots one 1.04 acres and the other 1.5 acres. This development is being proposed using the newly established City Center Zoning Ordinance adopted by the Council at the end of 2012.
- Look for the official council agendas as they are posted at the city office and on the State of Utah Public Notice Website at http://www.utah.gov/pmn/index.html. The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

Remember—North Logan City office has a PRESCRIPTION DROP BOX ... Does your medicine cabinet have outdated medication, old pills of cough syrups? The drop box is inside the City Office (2076 N 1200 E) and is open from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. You can leave the pills in the bottles or pour them in a plastic <u>sealed</u> bag for disposal.

We are now asking that people who use sharps on a regular basis, to dispose of the sharps into an empty milk jug. When filled, take the milk jug directly to the Police Station at 42 E 2200 N, Ste C. for disposal.

Children's Weight Loss

Worried about your child's weight? Be careful on how you handle the situation. When an adult wants to gain or lose weight they either eat more calories than the body uses or less calories than the body uses. This may not be the best solution for children. They are still growing and their bodies are changing. It is best to consult your child's doctor on the proper way to handle the situation. doctor may decide that your child just needs to grow into his body by not gaining any more weight. Your doctor will know what will be best for your child. Children and adults should avoid fad diets or quick weight loss programs. They usually do not work and can cause other harm to you or your child. The best solution is to eat a balanced diet with a variety of healthy foods and crease physical activity.

Change in City Boundary between North Logan and Logan Being Considered

The City Council is working on a proposed adjustment to the city's boundary with Logan City. A public hearing is planned on the issue to be held during the council's meeting on June 12th. Currently the boundary between North Logan and Logan City on the west side of Main Street is convoluted and confusing.

For example, did you know that the Tesoro gas station on the corner of 2500 North and Main and the Sonic drive-in both are in Logan city's boundaries while Wingers and the Holiday Inn Express are in North Logan? Also, the new car portion of Ensign Toyota is in Logan while the used car part of their business, on the south end of their property, is in North Logan.

The two cities have been trying, for years, to straighten out the boundary in this area. Emergency responders need a clear understanding of which property is in which jurisdiction; and when sales taxes are collected, businesses in this area that are not clear which city they are in often have their sales taxes counted towards the wrong city and the process to correct such misallocation of sales taxes, once paid, is not an easy process. The map here shows the current and proposed boundaries and an article on the city's website will provide you more details, and which properties and businesses will be changing jurisdictions, if this boundary change is adopted by the two cities.
