MAYOR'S MESSAGE:

Last month, I mentioned the upcoming cycle of our election process and within a few days of this mailing you will be able to express your interest in running for elected positions at the city level. There are two council seats and the City Mayor which will be up for election. I want to clarify that I do not intend to run for a second term as Mayor. However, I look forward to supporting our new Mayor in any way that I am able during the transition at the end of the year. One last reminder is that you need to register your intent and declare your candidacy in person at the city offices between June 3rd and June 7th between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m..

I also wanted to take a portion of this newsletter to express appreciation to all of the volunteers who give so much time and energy to some of our greatest cultural and traditional treasures we have here in North Logan. There are so many who help on the Historical Committee; the Tree committee; the Parks and Recreation committee; the Safety committee; the Library Board and the Friends of the Library; Art on the Lawn volunteers; the City Center Committee; the Cemetery Committee; the 24th of July celebration volunteers and all those who are part of the parade; the Pumpkin Walk Committee; our volunteers during our service days; the Youth City Council; the Easter Egg organizers, and many others who quietly serve in unofficial capacities. You are all great and you make this city a wonderful place to live and be a part of. Thanks again for all you do. You are amazing. Speaking of "Art on the Lawn", don't forget to visit the 9th annual event on Saturday, June 29th from 10:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. We appreciate Cary and Lucy Watkins and all of those who help them in this annual tradition.

- **Art on the Lawn** is a North Logan community event that is well known throughout Cache Valley and beyond. It started out as an informal art event with just a few people participating and has since grown. Last year more than 1000 people came and enjoyed a great summer day with their friends and families. *It will be on Saturday June 29th from 10:00am to 6:00pm . It's free to the public.* 
- The Dean F. & Bessie Peterson Foundation was created by Cary & Lucy Peterson Watkins to honor the memory of Dean F. Peterson, and Bessie C. Peterson. They were a force in the community providing financial assistance and encouragement for the education of young men and women. The foundation provides gifts to promote art and literacy education. Monies are raised through donations from individuals, and private enterprise. An annual event within the foundation called "Art on the Lawn" is held at the historic grounds where Dean Peterson's mother, Lucille lived. This landmark 123 year old property located at 1491 East and 2300 North has been restored and is on the Utah State Historical record. It is now part of the property owned by Lucy and Cary Watkins.
- Now in its 10th year, Art on the Lawn has become a tradition in North Logan. More than \$60,000 has been raised by this charity and the money has gone to help fund art programs in the local high schools, provide art scholarships and has provided \$13,000 to the North Logan Friends of the Library.
- The city and community pitches in to make Art on the Lawn happen. North Logan artists and many others from other communities in Cache Valley will be exhibiting their art. Renowned North Logan artist, Michael Bingham will have two 4x8 murals which will be painted by the community. He will also sponsor "Art in a bag". Friends of the Library Linda & Joe Keith, along with Joe Hawkes organize volunteers to sell Aggie ice cream, soft drinks and hot dogs. Ken Cook of the Antique Car Club drive in classic cars for display. Other community volunteers help out setting up the event, providing entertainment and helping display art.

Public Notice of North Logan CITY MUNICIPAL ELECTION LEGAL NOTICE - Notice is hereby given that North Logan City will hold a Municipal General Election November 5, 2013, for the following offices:

- Mayor—4 year term
- Two (2) City Council Members—4 year terms

Persons desiring to be a candidate for the 2013 Municipal Election must file a declaration of candidacy or a nomination petition between June 3rd and June 7th, 2013 at the North Logan City Office in person to the City Recorder, 2076 North 1200 East, North Logan, Utah during regular office hours (weekdays between 8am and 5pm).

Candidates must meet the following qualifications: 1) Be a U.S. Citizen; 2) Be a registered voter of the City; 3) Be a resident of North Logan City for at least 365 consecutive days immediately preceding the date of the election; and 4) Have no felony convictions, unless their right to hold elective office has been restored. If necessary, a Primary Election will be held Tuesday, August 13, 2013. The Municipal election will be held Tuesday, November 5, 2013.

Note from the Sewer Department: Please, do not flush any sanitary wipes or baby wipes down the toilet, even if the label states that the wipes are "flushable". These wipes can clog sewer lines and cause large amounts of damage to your home and property.

Storm Water Pollution Prevention & Lawn Care - Here are some things we ought to think about in caring for our lawns to help reduce the impact on storm water pollution:

Yard Trimmings Management. Improper disposal of yard trimmings can lead to increased nutrient levels in runoff. Yard trimmings deposited on streets may be washed down storm sewers and result in elevated nutrient loadings to surface waters. Proper management of yard trimmings and home composting can reduce the level of nutrients in runoff and decrease overall runoff volumes through the addition of humus to the soil. Increased levels of humus enhance soil permeability, decrease erosion, and provide nutrients in a less soluble form than commercial fertilizers.

DO NOT PUT LAWN TRIMMINGS IN THE CANALS!

Smart Use of Fertilizers. Carefully consider the application of fertilizers to your lawn. Some studies have found that over 50 percent of the nitrogen in fertilizer leaches from lawns because they are improperly applied. Our canal system, which is also our main storm water conveyance system, can be overloaded with nitrogen and/or phosphorus. Smart use of fertilizers can effectively reduce nitrogen and phosphorus loadings on our waterways through the proper application of nutrients. Fertilizer costs may also be reduced. Follow instructions carefully on the products you buy and seek professional help.

Tips. There are some simple tips to follow in lawn care to help reduce pollution of our canals and ultimately the natural waterways in Cache Valley:

- Plant native plants to reduce the need for water, fertilizers, pesticides and herbicides.
- Use fertilizers and pesticides sparingly. Use a low to no phosphorus fertilizer. Apply only the recommended amounts and avoid applying if rain or wind is forecasted.
- Use organic, biodegradable, non-toxic pesticides. Use fertilizers with less than 2 percent phosphorous. Mix and load fertilizers or pesticides on the grass, not on driveways or paved surfaces. Apply only ¼ inch of water to soak lawn chemicals into the ground.
- Only treat problem areas with pesticides and fertilizers and use only the recommended amount for the area being treated. Save leftover amounts for future use.
- Do not over-fertilize. Excess fertilizer and pesticides can promote the growth of plants and algae that clog our water ways and contaminate fish and wildlife in and around them. Do not apply fertilizers, pesticides and herbicides near driveways, sidewalks or close to the canals. Sweep up excess amounts of fertilizers, pesticides and herbicides. Never hose them into storm drains. Avoid over watering, it washes excess lawn and garden chemicals into storm drains that flow to waterways.
- Dispose of yard waste properly. Do not blow, rake, or wash leaves, grass clippings, or excess chemicals into streets, gutters, or storm drains. It is a crime and could result in fines.
- Store left over fertilizers, pesticides, herbicides and other hazardous chemicals dry, covered areas to protect containers from deterioration resulting from exposure.



What's Happening in City Council?

The City Council meetings for the month of June will be on the second and third Wednesdays, June 12th and 19th. Notice that the council will not be meeting on what would have been their regular, first Wednesday - June 5th. The City Council meetings start at 6:30 pm and are held in the meeting room at the North Logan Library.

During the June 12th meeting the council will conduct three public hearings. At 6:40 and 6:45 the council will conduct public hearings on the 2013 and 2014 municipal budgets. Following the public hearings the council will discuss the budgets and make final changes in order to adopt the budgets during their June 19th meeting.

At 6:50 the council will hold a public hearing on the proposed boundary adjustment with Logan City. Following the hearing the council may discuss the proposed change and then during their June 19th meeting, they will consider adopting an ordinance making the boundary change official.

Look for the official council agendas as they are posted at the city office and on the State of Utah Public Notice Website at <http://www.utah.gov/pmn/index.html>. The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

ANNUAL CEMETERY FLOWERS AND DECORATION REMOVAL:

On June 10th we will be discarding all decorations and flowers from the Cemetery that appear out of condition or that are not in compliance the City's Cemetery Ordinance. This includes all shepherds hooks. This cleaning will take place semi-annually after the Memorial Day/Veterans Day holidays. Below is an excerpt from the Cemetery Ordinance. For the full ordinance please go to the City Website.

** "Glass containers (are) prohibited.....Small baskets, pots, cans, vases, toys, (flowers), decorations of any kind are acceptable as long as they remain **within the 6" concrete base** (mowing strip) on the **north and/or south** of the headstone/monument. Shepherds hooks, pinwheels, etc. , are permitted only within the places specifically provided for such in the headstone mowing strip. All decorations, vases, toys, etc. , are discouraged on the east and/or west mowing strip of the headstone, as these items may need to be removed."
