MAYOR'S MESSAGE:

Summer is quickly passing with it being one of the hottest in recent memory. With the summer season we enjoy activities that are compatible with the warmer months. Many of our annual celebrations such as Pioneer Day and Independence Day are annual events that we look forward to each year along with family vacations and neighborhood get-togethers.

Along with the positive activities, we also see an increase in other, less desirable things in the form of door-to-door solicitation. Recently we have had some instances where some friends and neighbors have fallen victim to solicitors who are without license or authorization to sell door to door. In these instances, items of lesser value have been sold for 5 to 10 times their real value with solicitors never to be seen again once the money has been received.

While there are legitimate businesses that go door-to-door and offer a quality service or perhaps a fundraising opportunity, it is important that we are on guard for those who would take advantage of elderly neighbors or those less suspecting. If there is any question in your mind, please call the North Park Police Department after sending the solicitor on their way and inform them that you suspect a non-legitimate salesperson or some other scam. Make it a regular practice to ask for ID and company name so that you can validate their solicitation even after they have gone. Door-to-door solicitors should also have a North Logan City ID badge. It is never a good experience when one of our friends or neighbors have been violated in some fashion. Lets continue to enjoy this time of year and be on the lookout for those things that would distract from our positive summer activities. I wish everyone a wonderful rest of the summer.

What's Happening in City Council?

The City Council meetings for the month of August will be on the first and third Wednesdays, August 7th and August 21st. The City Council meetings start at 6:30 pm and are held in the meeting room at the North Logan Library.

During the August 7th meeting the council will consider some funding options for a new water well to be drilled in the mouth of Green Canyon. They also plan on awarding the bids for the construction of the new police building in order to start its construction shortly thereafter.

During either, or both of the August meetings, the Council will continue its consideration of the proposed boundary change between North Logan and Logan City as has been discussed over the past several months.

The City Council and the Planning Commission are working on several ordinances, some of which may be ready for official consideration during August. These possible ordinances include regulating businesses that specialize in products for adults such as tobacco shops and tattoo parlors, an ordinance requiring wiring for streetlights to be a part of new subdivisions, and a change to the ordinances on noxious weed nuisances. Other ordinances on land donations and required park improvements for "Density Bonus" subdivisions may also be discussed. All of these potential ordinances are still in the concept stage and may or may not be ready for discussion by the council. Look for the official council agendas as they are posted at the city office and on the State of Utah Public Notice Website at <http://www.utah.gov/pmn/index.html>. The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

Street Status Change

We are fast approaching the start of a new school year on the 22nd of August. As we have evaluated, our safe walking routes to our elementary schools we have decided to make a change in one of our streets status for two reasons. One is student pedestrian safety and the other is road maintenance. During the first part of August the section of 600 East from 2200 North to 2500 North will be closed to through traffic. The road will be closed at 2500 North and at approximately 2400 North. All residences along 600 East will have access from 2200 North 600 East. Farmers who have cultivated land along this section will have gated access to the closed section of 600 East. This change will provide a safer walking route for children and will help the city maintain the existing roadway.

Water Conservation

With limited snowfall this past winter, North Logan City's culinary water supply is well short of average. Hopefully, the City will not need to impose water restrictions during the month of August and September. However, in order to maintain City drinking water storage amounts at a safe level, we are asking residents to conserve water where possible on landscaping, and please do not wash cars, or spray driveways or sidewalks with culinary water. Stormwater Concern: We are asking the residents of North Logan, to please not place piles of topsoil, mulch, woodchips, gravel, dirt, tree limbs, or landscaping materials of any kind in the curb or roadway. A portion of these piles of material usually ends up in our inlet boxes, stormwater pipes, and canals, which may cause future flooding concerns and could potentially contaminate our surface water/ground water.

TIME TO LICENSE YOUR PETS!

Did you know that cats and dogs are to be licensed in North Logan City? Whether your pet is an inside pet or an outside pet, they must have a current rabies vaccination & be licensed. Only two dogs or four cats are allowed on residential property zoned less than one acre. Properties of more than one acre and appropriately zoned, may apply for a *Conditional Use Permit* to have more than two dogs/four cats. Application for a *Conditional Use Permit* is \$100 (one-time fee only). If the permit is authorized by the Planning & Zoning Committee, a \$50 kennel license fee is required. Renewal for the kennel license is yearly, payable every January.
