We are enduring a long hot summer and water shortages. I propose Citywide irrigation water. We can do this by capturing excess water in Swift Slough and pumping it to a collection pond at the Library, from there to a larger lake at Elk Ridge Park, on up the road to a Cemetery reflecting pool. From there the water is pumped to small, eastside reservoir in Beef Hollow at approximately 5400 feet, setting the blue line. A gravity fed line will supply a larger reservoir in Green Canyon at about 5200 feet. This will facilitate the provision of irrigation water throughout the whole City.

We are benefiting greatly from the wisdom and vision of our predecessors with the canals and secondary water. This will complete and extend their legacy to all residents, but will also add a succession of green oasis', urban fisheries, and blue gathering spaces that will not only flesh out their pioneer legacy but will contribute greatly to an enhanced sense of place and a much stronger community identity. If elected in four years we will be well on our way to Citywide irrigation water, or we will know the reason why it cannot be done.



Water Conservation Notice Still In Place for September:

North Logan City would like to thank residents for their efforts to abide by the conservation measures put in place in August. Your support has DEFINITELY been noticeable within the system. In order to maintain drinking water storage amounts at a safe level, we ask that residents/businesses continue to reduce culinary water usage by 25% and to significantly reduce culinary water on lawns during the month of October.

Don't forget to license your dogs and cats through the city! Come by the City Offices to learn more.

STORMWATER CONCERN

We are asking the residents of North Logan, to please not place piles of topsoil, mulch, woodchips, gravel, dirt, tree limbs, or landscaping materials of any kind in the curb or roadway. A portion of these piles of material usually ends up in our inlet boxes, stormwater pipes, and canals, which may cause future flooding concerns and could potentially contaminate our surface water/ground water.

Fire Prevention Week Open House- Join us Thursday, October 10th at 6:30PM for our annual open house. This year marks the twentieth anniversary of the North Logan Fire Department. There will be demonstrations and exhibits, Smokey the Bear will be there, as well.
