As many of you may recall, North Logan had the only official Olympic venue in Cache Valley with the Eccles Ice Rink where Olympic Athletes came from all over the world to get ready to compete for Olympic Gold.

As part of our 80 year celebration, we have identified March to recognize North Logan's Olympic history and invite any of our North Logan citizens to come to the Eccles Ice Center and enjoy a night of skating, hot chocolate and good company. We think it might be too large of a group to all go there on one night so we would like to invite roughly the north half of the city to the ice center on Wednesday, March 12<sup>th</sup> between 6:30 and 8:45 pm; and the south half of the city on Thursday, March 13<sup>th</sup>, between 6:15 and 8:30 pm. Think roughly 2200 or 2300 North to divide the city in half. Your skate rental charges will be covered as well as your admission, so just come and have fun. We will be also be giving away some SLC 2002 Olympic pins and other prizes each evening, so put on some skates and show us your skills or simply learn how to glide on ice for the first time.

We look forward to seeing as many of our neighbors and friends there as possible. Have a wonderful March and enjoy the changing weather.

## What's Happening in City Council?

The City Council meetings for the month of March will be on the first and third Wednesdays, March 5<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>. The City Council meetings start at 6:30 pm.

During the March 5<sup>th</sup> meeting a representative from the Bear River Health Department will present its annual report to the City Council. Also during the March 5<sup>th</sup> meeting the City Council and the Planning Commission will be meeting together to continue working on the land-use element of the general plan. Specifically to be discussed is establishing "district plans". The idea for these district plans is to identify the land-use characteristics in some sub-units of the city in such a way that the city can better plan how to ensure that the character of the city is maintained as development continues to come to North Logan.

Staff is working on putting together the 2015 municipal budget which will be adopted in June. During the March 19<sup>th</sup> council meeting, city staff members will begin to make budget presentations to the City Council. Some departments will make similar presentations in April and May in preparation for public hearings on the budget planned for June 4<sup>th</sup>.

The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

## Storm Water Pollution Prevention-Take Care of Your Trash, Trash Bins, and Dumpsters

Post "No Littering" signs and enforce anti-litter laws. Provide a sufficient number of litter receptacles for your home or business. Clean out and cover litter receptacles frequently to prevent spillage.

Keep dumpster areas clean. Recycle materials whenever possible. Use all of a product before disposing of the container. Ensure that only appropriate solid wastes are added to the solid waste container. Certain wastes such as hazardous wastes, appliances, fluorescent lamps, pesticides, etc., may not be disposed of in solid waste containers. Take special care when loading or unloading wastes to minimize losses.

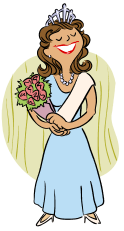
Inspect dumpsters and trash bins weekly for leaks and to ensure that lids are on tightly. Replace any that are leaking, corroded, or otherwise deteriorating. Sweep and clean the storage area regularly and clean up spills immediately. If the dumpster area is paved, do not hose it down to a storm drain. Instead, use dry methods when possible (e.g., sweeping, use of absorbents). Prevent storm water run-on from entering the dumpster area by enclosing it or building a berm around the area. Prevent waste materials from directly contacting rain. Cover dumpsters to prevent rain from washing waste out of holes or cracks in the bottom of trash bins or dumpsters.

## North Logan City Fire Department

Recently, the North Logan Fire Department celebrated 20 years of dedicated service. During the first years, we responded to fewer than 20 calls per year. In the years since, we have added a full-time fire chief who oversees a full-time fire marshal and thirty-four volunteer firefighters. In 2013 we were dispatched to 522 calls, made 276 inspection and permit contacts, had 263 hours related to public outreach and education, and 5,184 training hours.

In order to meet some of the staffing challenges inherent to a volunteer fire department, in 2012 we added crew sleeping quarters. While no single solution is the answer to all challenges, adding crew quarters has allowed us to keep up with a changing volunteer demographic as well as reduce the time it takes to respond to an emergency.

## Do you Own a Pet in North Logan?

All dogs and cats are to be licensed, whether they are inside pets or outside pets, and have current rabies vaccinations. If your pet(s) is not licensed, please stop by the City Office at 2076 N 1200 E. Be sure to bring the certificate of rabies vaccination and proof if spayed/neutered provided by your vet. The licensing fees include \$10 for dog spayed/neutered, \$20 if not, and \$5 for cats spayed/neutered, \$10 if not. Thank you for your cooperation!
