## What's Happening in City Council?




The City Council meetings for the month of June will be on the first and third Wednesdays, June 4<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>. The City Council meetings start at 6:30 pm.

The council will continue to put together the 2015 municipal budget which will be adopted during the June 18<sup>th</sup> meeting. During both council meetings, city staff members will make budget presentations to the city council. On June 4<sup>th</sup>, the council will hold a public hearing to receive public input on the budget and will discuss the budget as a whole. During the June 18<sup>th</sup> council meeting, the council will approve the final budget as well as a budget for the redevelopment agency.

During both meetings the council will continue to discuss the formation of a police agency combining with Hyde Park and possibly Smithfield with the hopes to have such in place before the start of the new fiscal year in July.

The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

If you received a phone call, text or email from the city, then you have successfully given the city your updated contact information, as requested in previous newsletters. If you did not receive a phone call, text, and/or email, or if you would like to change your primary contact information, we ask you to please come in to the city office and complete the form with your updated information or call the city office. Having your updated information allows the city to effectively notify citizens of scheduled water shut-offs or emergencies like the one that happened recently. ## **A Message from the Police Desk: Avoiding Fraud**

The chances are very good that you may be targeted as a possible victim of fraud within the next year. As technology advances, it brings resources and information into our lives at a faster and faster rate. It also opens the doors for criminals to creatively attempt to defraud you. Let me highlight some of the most common scams that we are seeing:



- Using online advertising (KSL.com and/or Craigslist.org) to sell stolen items.
- Someone sees your advertisement on KSL.com and wants to buy the item. They want you to take a check for more than the amount of the asking purchase price and have you forward the balance to another party. Truth is, the check they are going to pay you with is fraudulent. They want you to deposit it in your account and then draw funds from your account to forward. You lose when the original check you deposited returns as a fake.
- Posing as a property owner wishing to rent apartments or townhouses. They advertise on Craigslist and communicate with prospective renters by using email. The truth is, they do not own the property and are trying to get prospective renters to send a deposit.
- A phone caller poses as a grandchild that is in trouble (arrested and in jail usually in Canada or Mexico) and needs money. They want you to send the money through Western Union or money gram. They also want you to keep it confidential. Truth is, your grandchild is just fine and is not in Canada or Mexico.
- Be wary of unsolicited calls from supposed product representatives, such as computer software providers. They may try to convince you of a problem your computer may have and ask you for a visa card number or bank account number to buy service. **STOP!** Hang up and look up a number for the company the caller reported to represent. Call them yourself and ask to confirm the first call. Chances are it is a scam. They just want your account information.

Doing the following may help ward off fraud:

- Check your credit card statements regularly to make sure you do not have charges made by someone else.
- Do a credit check to review what credit accounts are attached to your name.

These do not cover all the ways criminals try to defraud us so if you have questions about any activity that you think might be a fraud or scam, give us a call (435-753-7600). If we don't know for sure then we will do some research to determine if it is legitimate. -Chief Kim W. Hawkes



A portion of those piles of material usually ends up in our inlet boxes, stormwater pipes, and canals, which may cause future flooding concerns and could potentially contaminate our surface water/ground water.

**Art on the Lawn** is a North Logan community event that is well known throughout Cache Valley and beyond. It started out as an informal art event with just a few people participating and has since grown. Last year more than 1000 people came and enjoyed a great summer day with their friends and families. *It will be on Saturday, June 28 from 10:00am - 6:00pm. It's free to the public.*

The Dean F. & Bessie Peterson Foundation was created by Cary & Lucy Peterson Watkins to honor the memory of Dean F. Peterson, and Bessie C. Peterson. They were a force in the community providing financial assistance and encouragement for the education of young men and women. The foundation provides gifts to promote art and literacy education. Monies are raised through donations from individuals, and private enterprise. An annual event within the foundation called “**Art on the Lawn**” is held at the historic grounds where Dean Peterson's mother, Lucille lived. This landmark 124 year old property located at 1491 E 2300 N has been restored and is on the Utah State Historical record. It is now part of the property owned by Lucy and Cary Watkins..

Now as a tradition of North Logan, Art on the Lawn has raised more than \$65,000 and the money has gone to help fund art programs in the local high schools, provide art scholarships and has provided money to the North Logan Friends of the Library.
