## NORTH LOGAN CITY DAY OF SERVICE SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 20, 2014

North Logan's next Day of Service is Saturday, September 20, 2014. We need your help.

Individuals in our community already perform innumerable acts of service on a daily basis. However, larger scale projects requiring multiple hands are scheduled for September 20th. Many individuals making seemingly small contributions working together with heart and little concern for recognition or credit can do wonders and bring service to a whole new level. ## What's Happening in City Council?

The City Council meeting for the month of September will be held only on the fourth Wednesday, September 24th. The City Council meetings start at 6:30 pm. The city council members will be attending Utah League of Cities and Towns Convention during what would have been their normal meeting on the second Wednesday, September 10th.

At the time this newsletter was put together, the city staff had no agenda items for the September meeting. During that September 24th meeting, the council may however continue to discuss possible changes to city regulations which may help control the urban deer herd and review some density issues in the city's zoning ordinance.

The council will also continue to discuss economic development in the city including the possibility of acquiring the services of an economic development specialist to do some specific work for the city.

The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

## **\*\*Water Conservation Notice\*\***

North Logan City drilled another culinary well this past winter. At this time, the culinary well is still being equipped and connected to our system. This connection will most likely take place this fall. However, until that connection takes place the City's water supply is still far below average, and aquifer levels remain at very low levels. In order to maintain City drinking water storage amounts at a sustainable level, we are asking residents to conserve culinary water where possible on landscaping and please avoid/reduce washing cars. Do not spray driveways or sidewalks with culinary water. During the month of August, your voluntary conservation made a vast difference in maintaining our water supply at a sustainable level. ## 2014 FOGGING SEASON



Fogging began throughout the District on June 2nd due to high numbers of adult mosquitoes and many reports of mosquito activity.

The field workers are checking standing bodies of water for mosquito larvae and treating them to prevent the larvae from growing into adults. Please check around your house and property for any trapped water (in tires, pails, gutters, etc.) and dump it out to reduce breeding and hatching areas for mosquitoes.

### *Fogging Schedule / Thursday for North Logan*

Fogging to control adult mosquitoes is only done for 2-3 hours after the sun sets so as to not harm beneficial insects such as bees and native pollinators. It is dependent on environmental conditions: a breeze between 1 and 10 mph, air temperature above 50F, and humidity. If it is too windy, too cold, or raining/drizzling, then the field workers will not fog.

Our foggers are equipped with a GPS tracker and a controller that provides a digital record of each evening's route and rate of application. All foggers are calibrated each season. The controller adjusts the rate of application depending on speed of the pickup (between 10 and 20 mph). The workers have equipment that allows them to measure wind speed and air temperature; they also record wind direction.

### *Courtesy No-Spray Requests*

When possible, the District will try to honor courtesy no-spray requests. If interested, please submit a request in writing in order for us to plan routes and accommodate no spray requests. ### **BECOME A NORTH LOGAN CITY 100-MILER!**


Have you ran/walked 100 miles yet? There's still time to do so! Residents of North Logan are encouraged to walk/run 100 miles between April 1st & October 5th.

### **ROAD CONSTRUCTION:**

It is hard to believe that we are back in school but the time has arrived. With school back in session it reminds us that we need to be gearing up for having student bike riders and pedestrians on our streets and sidewalks again. Here are some safety tips:

- Slow down and take your time, especially in school and residential areas
- Eliminate distractions while you are driving
- **Do Not** assume that kids have seen your vehicle approaching. It is typical for children to miss-judge distance and speed of vehicles
- When crossing guards are in the center of the crosswalk both sides of the crosswalk are closed to through traffic
- Take an opportunity to walk with your child along the route they will be traveling. Remind them of safety procedures to practice.
- If your child is riding a bike make sure they wear a helmet



### **Pollution Prevention in Outdoor Construction and Remodeling**

Construction and remodeling projects present special issues in storm water control and pollution prevention. Heavy rains could easily transfer exposed sediment to local waterways. Exposed soils and the addition of impervious building materials will likely contribute to excessive runoff and erosion problems. Fiber rolls or silt fence materials can be used to protect overturned soil prone to erosion during the construction process. Stacked bags of gravel or sand around storm drains will absorb eroded sediments while letting water pass through. Temporary seeding can be used to stabilize soils in areas that will be exposed for longer periods. Take care during any construction and remodeling projects around your home to be on the lookout for potential storm water pollution problems.

### Backup Prevention:

**DO NOT** flush the following materials (or similar items) down toilets or drains.

- Large quantities of toilet paper
- Feminine products & plastic applicators
- Live seeds, beans, and peas (they may sprout)
- Large quantities of cereals/grains (they swell with water)
- Fibrous materials (cotton balls, q-tips, baby wipes, hair, rags, cigarette butts)
- Sponges, scouring pads, shop rags
- Clothing - socks, underwear, etc.
- Paper towels
- Disposable diapers
- Grease, fats, oils
- Sand or dirt
- Plastic, metal, wood, etc.
