What's Happening in City Council?

The City Council will only meet once in the month of December. The December meeting will be on the 10th starting at 6:30 pm. At the time this newsletter was put together, the city staff had several agenda items for that December meeting. The council is working on a variety of other issues which may also be on that agenda or in January.

The development of the new high school, the park associated with it, a needed boundary change with Hyde Park, and the construction of the 200 East corridor between 2200 and 3100 North will continue to be discussed at almost every city council meeting for a while. Expect to see items related to these issues on the December agenda.

As part of the progress towards building the new high school, the council will consider a Concept Plan for the Cache Recreational Complex Subdivision, an eight (8) lot subdivision in the FR (Forest Recreation) zone located from approximately 2750 North to 3100 North along the east side of new proposed North Park Boulevard (200 East).

Also on the December agenda will be to receive a report regarding the findings of the financial audit for the city for FY2014. The council will also share lessons learned at this year's Utah League of Cities and Towns convention.

The council will also be considering a Concept Plan for a three (3) lot subdivision with a remaining parcel in the RE-1 zone on 7.10 acres located at approximately 3250 North and 1400 East.

Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.



What is an Illicit Discharge?

Stormwater regulations define it as "any discharge to a municipal separate storm sewer that is not composed entirely of stormwater." Basically only rain and snow melt are allowed in the City's storm drain system. This means vehicles/trailers/RV's, etc., cannot be parked on city streets, curbs and shoulders between **1:00 am - 5:00 am** on any day. Please let your family and friends know, as well as your renters if you have them, as citations will be issued during these hours. Do not put your garbage/recycling out the night before if it looks like there will be snow during the night. During other hours, if it is snowing, or beginning to snow, we would appreciate you not parking on the streets so that our snow plows can keep your roads clean and safe for you and your family.



Building Permits, when are they needed?



Did you know that any new building, new house, basement finish, addition, anything over 200 square feet (including sheds & patios), or most major renovations require a building permit? Please contact the City Office at 435-752-1310 ext 10, with any questions or stop by the office at 2076 N 1200 E, to pick up a permit information packet and application. All building permits are subject to a \$50 deposit at the time of submission, with the exception of basement finishes. We **DO NOT** take credit cards on building permits. Checks, money orders or cash are accepted.
