### Brown Lawns will be in Fashion this Year!

Spring is here and summer is on its way. This summer looks to bring us some challenges with water. The lack of snow pack will obviously impact our secondary water system for those who get water from our canals. It will also impact our culinary system. We are getting very little water out of Water Canyon and into our water treatment plant, so we are going to have to rely more on our City wells. Fortunately, we will soon have a large, new well brought online in the mouth of Green Canyon. This new well, coupled with the rest of our system, should supply what we need for our indoor water needs, but it will not be enough to replace the water we will be lacking from the canals. If everyone who normally waters with canal water turns to the culinary water system to replace it, our culinary water system will soon not be able to keep up.

Our canals are a great blessing to us and we rely on them to take care of a lot of our City's water needs in the summer. To make it through this summer we are all going to have to conserve our water in whatever ways we can.

The City has worked out a set of Water Shortage Management Policies and Procedures which, if followed, will allow us to stretch our water resources through the summer. The outline of this program is as follows:

	H <sub>2</sub> O Conservation Goal	Drought/Water Shortage Condition
Phase 1 - Green - Normal	Encourage water use conservation	No water supply problems.
Phase 2 - Yellow - Caution	15-20%	Moderate drought. Indications are that this condition will extend for the rest of the water season.
Phase 3 - Orange - High Caution	30-40%	Moderate to severe drought conditions. Water supply is not meeting the demand.
Phase 4 - Red - Warning	50-60%	Extreme, progressive, severe drought. Critical need to reduce water usage and increase water management strategies.
Phase 5 - Purple - Severe	75% and even more if needed	Most severe drought. Supply not able to keep up with the demand and/or there is a possibility of mandatory shut off of water service for part or all of the City. Includes when water is being shut off due to contamination.

As your mayor I have taken measures to implement phase 2, the yellow level, beginning this spring. This means we should all look for ways to save 20% of our normal water consumption, such as reducing outside watering by one day per week. We should do that for our indoor use as well as our outdoor use, including our secondary water. Let's not run water unnecessarily, we need to water our lawns less. Avoid watering during daytime hours when we lose so much to evaporation. The canal companies may want some folks to use that water during the day to spread out water consumption over time; but we should not be using culinary water on our lawns and gardens during the day.

### Stormwater Concern:

We are asking the residents of North Logan, to please not place piles of topsoil, mulch, woodchips, gravel, dirt, tree limbs, or landscaping materials of any kind in the curb or roadway. A portion of those piles of material usually ends up in our inlet boxes, stormwater pipes, and canals, which may cause future flooding concerns and could potentially contaminate our surface water/ground water.

## What's Happening in City Council?

The City Council meetings for the month of May will be on the second and fourth Wednesdays, May 13<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>. The City Council meetings start at 6:30 pm and are held in the meeting room at the North Logan Library.

On May 13<sup>th</sup>, the City Council will receive budget presentations by the Streets Department, the Utilities Department (Water and Sewer), and the Library. These presentations are regarding the municipal budget for the new fiscal year beginning in July. During the May 27<sup>th</sup> meeting there will be public hearings on the budget, both proposed changes to the current fiscal year as well as the proposed new budget which begins in July.

The council will also hold another public hearing during the May 27<sup>th</sup> meeting, a hearing regarding the proposed annexation of a little over five acres of land between North Logan and Hyde Park at around 600 East and 2650 North, just northeast of the new police station.

## WHAT'S WITH ALL THE TRUCKS?

MANY OF OUR RESIDENTS ARE ASKING QUESTIONS ABOUT THE DRAMATIC INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF TRUCKS HAULING GRAVEL THROUGH NORTH LOGAN, ESPECIALLY ON 1900 N, 2100 N, 2300/2500 N AND 1600, 800, AND 400 EAST. THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION IS PROVIDED TO HELP OUR RESIDENTS UNDERSTAND WHAT IS GOING ON.

GRAVEL OR OTHER TYPES OF SOILS EXTRACTION, MEANING REMOVING IT AND TRANSPORTING IT TO A DIFFERENT PROPERTY, IN AN AMOUNT OVER 1,000 CUBIC YARDS PER ACRE IS REGULATED BY CITY ORDINANCE. SUCH REMOVAL, IF DONE AS PART OF A SUBDIVISION HOWEVER IS EXEMPT FROM THE NORMAL EXTRACTION POLICY ORDINANCE BUT IS INSTEAD REGULATED BY THE DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT FOR THAT SUBDIVISION. THE GRAVEL OPERATIONS CURRENTLY UNDERWAY FALL INTO THIS SUBDIVISION DEVELOPMENT SET OF REGULATIONS. RUPP'S TRUCKING IS EXTRACTING GRAVEL AS PART OF THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE CANYON GATES SUBDIVISION WHICH IS GOING IN EAST OF 1600 EAST AND BETWEEN ABOUT 2000 N AND 2400 N.

A GOOD SHARE OF THE LAND IMMEDIATELY WEST OF THE MOUTH OF GREEN CANYON IS PART OF A FEMA FLOOD PLAIN, RUNNING AS FAR WEST AS 1250 EAST 2700 N. THOSE RESIDENTS WHO WERE HERE IN 1983 KNOW THAT A PRETTY SUBSTANTIAL FLOOD DANGER EXISTS FOR NORTH LOGAN CITY WHEN UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS, WATER COMING OUT OF GREEN CANYON CAN CAUSE A LOT OF DAMAGE IN THE CITY. PART OF THE APPROVAL FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE CANYON GATES SUBDIVISION INCLUDED THE CONSTRUCTION OF A SERIES OF STORM WATER RETENTION BASINS IN THE MOUTH OF GREEN CANYON WHICH ARE LARGE ENOUGH TO CONTAIN A REASONABLY EXPECTED FLOOD OUT OF THE CANYON. ONCE THESE BASINS ARE BUILT THE DESIGNATED FLOOD PLAIN WILL CHANGE AND ALL FLOOD WATERS WOULD, IN THEORY, STAY IN THESE BASINS.

THE AMOUNT OF GRAVEL COMING OUT OF THAT SUBDIVISION IS SUBSTANTIAL AND WILL PROBABLY GO ON FOR SEVERAL MONTHS AND EVEN LONGER IF WHOEVER GETS THE BID TO CONSTRUCT THE NEW 200 EAST (2200 TO 3100 N – INCLUDING ACROSS THE FRONT OF THE NEW HIGH SCHOOL) CHOOSES TO USE THIS MATERIAL TO BUILD THAT ROAD. RUPP'S TRUCKING HAS BEEN AUTHORIZED TO EXTRACT FROM THAT AREA FOR SEVERAL YEARS NOW BUT WITH THE SLOW ECONOMY THEY HAVE HAD VERY FEW JOBS THAT REQUIRE GRAVEL FROM THAT PIT.

WITH RUPP'S TRUCKING GETTING THE BID FOR PROVIDING GRAVEL FOR THE NEW HIGH SCHOOL SITE, THEY HAVE BEEN HAULING A LOT TO THAT AREA (NORTH OF MEADOW VIEW PARK). IN ORDER TO TRY TO SAVE ON HAVING ONE SET OF RESIDENTS EXPERIENCE THE BRUNT OF THE OPERATIONS, WE HAVE TOLD RUPP'S WHICH ROADS TO USE ON WHICH DAYS. THERE ARE CERTAIN ROADS LIKE 2500 N WEST OF 800 E WHICH IS ON THEIR ROUTES EVERYDAY BECAUSE THAT IS THE ONLY WAY THAT WORKS FOR THEM TO GET THE SOILS INTO THE SCHOOL AREA, BUT EAST OF 800 EAST THEY ARE USING 1900 ONE DAY A WEEK AND THEN 2100 AND 2300/2500 NORTH EACH TWO DAYS A WEEK. THEY ARE NOT SUPPOSED TO HAUL ON WEEKENDS OR HOLIDAYS.

LEGRAND JOHNSON HAS HAD A GRAVEL PIT OPERATION ON THE EAST END OF 2100 N FOR MANY YEARS AS WELL. THEY TELL US THAT THERE IS VERY LITTLE REMAINING, USEFUL GRAVEL IN THEIR PIT AND THEIR MOST RECENT EXTRACTION HAS BASICALLY DEPLETED THEIR PIT.

THE CITY OFFICIALS ARE KEENLY AWARE OF THE ADVERSE IMPACT THESE OPERATIONS HAVE ON OUR RESIDENTS AS WELL AS THE WEAR AND TEAR ON OUR ROADS. IN SOME WAYS IT WILL BE GOOD TO GET THE GRAVEL EXTRACTED FROM THE CANYON GATES STORM WATER BASINS IN A SHORT AMOUNT OF TIME RATHER THAN HAVING IT DRAG OUT FOR PERHAPS TEN YEARS AT A SLOWER PACE, BUT IT DOES CAUSE US PROBLEMS NOW.

THE BOTTOM LINE IS THAT THIS GRAVEL EXTRACTION WILL CONTINUE FOR SOME TIME BUT THE END RESULT WILL BE A STORM WATER RETENTION AREA TO PROTECT THE CITY FROM FLOODS OUT OF GREEN CANYON. THE STORM WATER RETENTION AREA WILL EVENTUALLY BECOME PUBLIC PROPERTY AND IS PLANNED FOR SOME KIND OF PARK USE AS WELL.

### ANNUAL CEMETERY FLOWERS AND DECORATION REMOVAL:

Two weeks after Memorial Day we will be discarding all decorations and flowers from the Cemetery that appear out of condition or that are not in compliance with the City's Cemetery Ordinance. This includes **shepherd's hooks**. This cleaning will take place semi-annually after the Memorial Day/Veterans Day holidays. Below is an excerpt from the Cemetery Ordinance. For the full ordinance please go to the City website, [www.northlogancity.org](http://www.northlogancity.org).

**\*\* “Glass containers (are) prohibited. ...Small baskets, pots, cans, vases, toys, (flowers), decorations of any kind are acceptable as long as they remain within the 6” concrete base (mowing strip) on the north and/or south of the headstone/monument. Shepherd's hooks, pinwheels, etc., are permitted only within the places specifically provided for such in the headstone mowing strip. All decorations vases, toys, etc., are discouraged on the east and/or west mowing strip of the headstone, as these items may need to be removed.”**



### ***A note from your utility billing department . . .***



It is time to check the area around your water meter. **Please make sure your meter lid is uncovered and free from any of the following:** railroad ties, flower boxes, sprinkler boxes, dirt, bushes and grass, or any obstacle. Trim back all bushes and plants around the meter. Our meter readers are trying to get an accurate reading, and they are also looking for any problems in the meter barrel. When they have easy access to the meters, it makes it possible for them to do their job. The majority of North Logan property owners are always so willing to do their part to help us out. Thank you so much for your support!

Just a reminder, please **don't open the water meter lids** to check your reading or turn off your water. There are radios, touch pads and wires that can easily be broken. If you need your water service turned off, please contact us at 435-752-1310 extension 11 or 10, and we will get someone from the city to meet you unless it is an emergency and you are flooding. In that case, go ahead and turn it off to stop any further damage.

Paying your bill can be easy with Direct Pay. If you are interested in having your bill paid directly from your checking account, bring in a voided check and sign-up for this easy program. You can also log onto our website and pay through another program. This method is through a third party so it does charge you a small fee. Let us know if you have any questions. ### ***From the Desk of Chief Hawkes, North Park Police Department***

***In 1962, President Kennedy proclaimed May 15 as National Peace Officers Memorial Day and the calendar week in which May 15 falls, as National Police Week. Established by a joint resolution of Congress in 1962, National Police Week pays special recognition to those law enforcement officers who have lost their lives in the line of duty for the safety and protection of others.***



***At the State Capital in Salt Lake City on the west side of the grounds you will find the Utah Law Enforcement Memorial. On its wall are the names of 137 Utah Law Enforcement Officers who have lost their lives in the line of duty, the first being Deputy Rodney Badger in 1853.***

***During the week of May 10<sup>th</sup> Through May 16<sup>th</sup> you will notice 137 U.S. Flags lining the entryway to the North Park Police Department. Each Flag is a memorial to the officers of this state who have given their all for us. I would encourage you to visit the memorial on Capitol Hill the next time you are visiting Salt Lake City with your family. The Members of the North Park Police Department are proud to serve you and dedicate ourselves to our moto of Respect, Integrity, Courage and Honor.***

### ***From the North Logan Fire Department:***

***"The early warm weather and lack of precipitation this year has caused otherwise green, spring-like fuels to rapidly lose their moisture. This means we are anticipating an early and extended fire season for 2015.***
