MAYOR'S MESSAGE:

Art on the Lawn is a North Logan community event that is well known throughout Cache Valley and beyond. The "Best little art show in Utah"--- Salt Lake Tribune. Starting out as an informal art event with just a few people participating, it has since grown. Last year more than 1,000 people came and enjoyed a great summer day with their friends and families. This year, it will be held on **Saturday June 27th from 10:00am to 6:00pm. It's free to the public!**



The Dean F. & Bessie Peterson Foundation was created by Cary & Lucy Peterson Watkins to honor the memory of Dean F. Peterson and Bessie C. Peterson. They were a force in the community providing financial assistance and encouragement for the education of young men and women. The foundation provides gifts to promote art and literacy education. Monies are raised through donations from individuals, and private enterprise. An annual event within the foundation called "**Art on the Lawn**" is held at the historic grounds where Dean Peterson's mother, Lucille lived. This landmark 124 year old property located at 1491 East and 2300 North has been restored and is on the Utah State Historical record. It is now part of the property owned by Lucy and Cary Watkins.

Now in its 11th year, Art on the Lawn has become a tradition in North Logan. More than \$70,000 have been raised by this charity and the money has gone to help fund art programs in the local high schools, provide art scholarships, and has provided \$14,000 to the North Logan Friends of the Library.

The City and community pitch in to make Art on the Lawn happen. North Logan artists and many others from other communities in Cache Valley will be exhibiting their art. There will also be a display of classic cars. Entertainment will be featured all day.

What's Happening in City Council?

The City Council meetings for the month of June will be on the second and fourth Wednesdays, June 10th and 24th. The City Council meetings start at 6:30 pm and are held in the meeting room at the North Logan Library.

On June 10th, the City Council will consider an ordinance affecting the annexation of a little over five acres of land between North Logan and Hyde Park at around 600 East and 2650 North, just northeast of the new police station. Also during this meeting the council will consider several budget resolutions, both proposed changes to the current fiscal year, as well as adopting the proposed new budget which begins in July.

During the June 24th meeting, at 6:35, the council will hold a public hearing to receive input on a proposed boundary change with Hyde Park City in the approximate area of 2850 to 3100 North and between Main Street and 400 East, the area where the new high school is being built.

Look for the official council agendas as they are posted at the City office and on the State of Utah Public Notice Website at <http://www.utah.gov/pmn/index.html>. The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

ANNUAL CEMETERY FLOWERS AND DECORATION REMOVAL:

Two weeks after Memorial Day we will be discarding all decorations and flowers from the Cemetery that appear out of condition or that are not in compliance with the City's Cemetery Ordinance. This includes **shepherd's hooks**. This cleaning will take place semi-annually after the Memorial Day/Veterans Day holidays. Below is an excerpt from the Cemetery Ordinance. For the full ordinance please go to the City website, www.northlogancity.org.

**** "Glass containers (are) prohibited....Small baskets, pots, cans, vases, toys, (flowers), decorations of any kind are acceptable as long as they remain within the 6" concrete base (mowing strip) on the north and/or south of the headstone/monument. Shepherd's hooks, pinwheels, etc., are permitted only within the places specifically provided for such in the headstone mowing strip. All decorations, vases, toys, etc., are discouraged on the east and/or west mowing strip of the headstone, as these items may need to be removed."**

Storm Water Pollution Prevention & Lawn Care - Here is something we ought to think about in caring for our lawns to help reduce the impact on storm water pollution:

Yard Trimmings Management. Improper disposal of yard trimmings can lead to increased nutrient levels in runoff. Yard trimmings deposited on streets may be washed down storm sewers and result in elevated nutrient loadings to surface waters. Proper management of yard trimmings and home composting can reduce the level of nutrients in runoff and decrease overall runoff volumes through the addition of humus to the soil. Increased levels of humus enhance soil permeability, decrease erosion, and provide nutrients in a less soluble form than commercial fertilizers.

DO NOT PUT LAWN TRIMMINGS IN THE CANALS!



NOTICE: With the recent rainfall received in the last few weeks, we are implementing phase 1 - the green level - no water supply problems, from our Water Shortage Management Policies and Procedures Plan. However, keeping in mind that this level could change any time, we are asking residents to please continue to conserve water in whatever ways we can so we can make it through the summer.
