## What's Happening in City Council?

There will only be one City Council meeting for the month of July. It will be on the fourth Wednesday, July 22<sup>nd</sup>. The City Council meeting will start at 6:30 pm and will be held in the meeting room at the North Logan Library.

At that meeting on July 22<sup>nd</sup> the City Council will consider an ordinance making effective a proposed boundary change with Hyde Park City in the approximate area of 2850 to 3100 North and between Main Street and 400 East, the area where the new high school is being built.

At the time of writing up the input for this newsletter, there were no other planned agenda items for that July meeting.

The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

**NOTICE: We are implementing phase 2 - the yellow level - Moderate drought, from our Water Shortage Management Policies and Procedures Plan.**

<b>Target</b>	Water Use Reduction: A city wide reduction of water usage of 15-20%.
<b>Reduction Strategies</b>	<p><b>Public Education and Encouragement:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Water users must cut back exterior watering by 15% (ie. users shall water no more than three days per week).</li> <li>• Commercial, Industrial, and Research Buildings cut back by 15% on all water usage (both inside/outside usage).</li> <li>• No washing of cars using culinary water at a home/residence.</li> <li>• No spraying sidewalks, driveways..etc. with a hose.</li> <li>• No excessive or wasteful watering.</li> <li>• City's splash pad will be reduced to 6 hours/day.</li> </ul> <p>The City may also monitor water usage through real time water meter reports. If a resident, commercial, industrial, or research related water user is using excessive amounts of culinary water they will be subject to the Enforcement standards.</p>

### Delinquent Utility Accounts

Those who have not paid the amount they owe on their North Logan Utility bill by the 15th of the second month are on our disconnect list. Generally we mail a disconnect notice to the owner, renter and landlord. We will begin sending a voice message or electronic message hopefully by next month. **This means you will not receive a pink notice.** If your bill is not paid by the due date, your water will be disconnected. If your water is disconnected you will be required to pay the full amount owing on your account plus the reconnect fee. The reconnect fee is \$25.00 the first time then increased to \$50.00 the second and \$100.00 the third time if within a year.

We are more than willing to make payment arrangements with you if you call before the disconnect day and as long as you have not made arrangements prior and not followed through with making those payments. Arrangements need to be made with Peggy and you can call her at 435-752-1310 ext 11.

## HOW TO PREVENT CONTAMINATION OF YOUR DRINKING WATER

*In light of what has happened recently in other cities, North Logan City wants to inform residents of things we all can do to prevent contamination.*

Water normally flows in one direction, from the public water system through the customer's cold or hot water plumbing to a sink tap or other plumbing fixture. The plumbing fixture is the end of the potable water system and the start of the waste disposal system.

Under certain conditions, water can flow in the reverse direction. This is known as **backflow**. Backflow occurs when a back-siphonage or backpressure condition is created in a water line.

**YOU CAN PROTECT YOUR DRINKING WATER BY TAKING THE FOLLOWING PRECAUTIONS:**

### DON'T:

- Submerge hoses in buckets, pools, tubs, sinks, ponds, etc.
- Use spray attachments without a backflow prevention device
- Connect waste pipes from water softeners or other treatment systems to the sewer, submerged drain pipe, etc.
- Use a hose to unplug blocked toilets, sewers, etc.



### Do:

- ◇ Keep the ends of hoses clear of all possible contaminants
- ◇ If not already equipped with an integral (built-in) vacuum breaker, buy and install hose bib type vacuum breakers on all threaded faucets around your home. These devices are inexpensive and are available at hardware stores and home improvement centers
- ◇ Install an approved backflow prevention assembly on all underground lawn irrigation systems. Remember, a plumbing permit is required for the connection of an underground lawn irrigation system to your plumbing system

### Stormwater Concern:

We are asking the residents of North Logan to please **not** place piles of topsoil, mulch, woodchips, gravel, dirt, tree limbs, or landscaping materials of any kind in the **curb** or **roadway**. A portion of those piles of material usually ends up in our inlet boxes, stormwater pipes, and canals, which may cause future flooding concerns and could potentially contaminate our surface water/ground water.
