new splash pad at Elk Ridge Park is nearing completion and will be available next spring thanks to the generous donations that have made this project a reality. One area of the new splash pad is being built with design and fundraising efforts from Up to 3 Early Intervention at the Center for Persons with Disabilities at Utah State University in conjunction with other generous donations. Thank you to those who have contributed to create a fun gathering place.

The Parks and Recreation Department and the Pumpkin Walk Committee, as well as many volunteers have been hard at work in preparation for our Pumpkin Days celebrations. North Logan's beloved Pumpkin Walk will be held October 22, 23, 24, 26, and 27. What's Happening in City Council?

The City Council meetings for the month of October and for the rest of the year will be changed to the first and third Wednesdays of each month. October's meetings will be on October 7th and 21st. The City Council meetings normally start at 6:30 pm and are held in the meeting room at the North Logan Library.

During the first October meeting on October 7th however, the City is planning a "Meet the Candidates Night," beginning at 6:00 pm. This event is for the public to hear from those running for three City Council positions in the upcoming municipal election. The Council may also if needed, conduct some business after the event, but currently nothing else is planned for that evening. At the time of writing up the input for this newsletter, the only other planned agenda items for the October 21st meeting are to continue to work on the City's General Plan and consider land transfers from the City to private ownership where it makes more sense to have the adjacent property owner take care of the piece rather than the City.

The Herald Journal is given a copy of the official agenda as well and they normally print it in the newspaper a day or two before the meeting.

From the Desk of Chief Hawkes: I thought it would be good to remind us of some driving rules that will help us be prepared for more pedestrians and bicyclists on the roadway and sidewalks. Schools are now in session. We have crossing guards at the location of 2500 N and 800 E, two at 2500 N 400 E, two at 2600 N 200 E and one at 2900 N 800 E. We encourage all children and adults escorting children to school to use the cross walks manned by our crossing guards. Drivers be aware that when a crossing guard is positioned in the middle of the cross walk, the entire crosswalk is activated and vehicles cannot legally pass through any part of the cross walk. Crossing guards are trained and required to stand in the middle of the cross walk and wait until the children are up on the curb they are crossing to before they can turn and walk back to their starting position. One of the most common violations that we see from drivers is when they make a right hand turn through a cross walk that still has the crossing guard in the middle of the cross walk. Be patient and take your time when driving so that everyone can get where they are going safely.

We have a critical need for a full time crossing guard. Interested parties must be at least 18 years of age and be available each school day from 8:30 AM to 9:10 AM and 3:20 PM to 3:50 PM. You can pick up an application at the North Park Police Department, 575 E 2500 N. Crossing guards are paid for one hour each shift.



Changes again! October 2015 iPad Class changing back to Thursdays at 2:00 p.m.

This month, Organize Your Life by using the following iPad/iPhone apps!

1 Oct- The "Contacts" app on your iPad is how you access and modify your contacts. Today you'll create a contact from scratch, search for a contact, and modify it later on.

8 Oct - Get Organized by learning how to create events on iPad's/iPhone's Calendar, including using Siri to help you create them. You'll also learn how to create multiple separate calendars (work, home, social & family, etc.) to organize events.



15 Oct - "Reminders" & "Setting Clock Alarms": You can get organized by learning how to create an ongoing list of tasks you need to accomplish or things to remember on the Reminders app.

Using Clock Alarms for an often recurring alarm (reminder) won't clutter up your Reminders list or the Calendar.

22 Oct - "Notes" is another organization app that comes with your iPad. Even though it is much more free form than Contacts, Calendar, Reminders and Clock Alarms, it can be useful for keeping quick notes or to-do lists.

29 Oct- You've been working hard getting organized. Now relax with a good book! Today you'll learn how to use and checkout the Library's Kindles. Each Kindle is preloaded with more than 150 books, each so simply available at a tap of your fingertips! Because you've been using your iPad, you'll be pleased at how quickly you'll learn how to use the Kindles!



To improve service quality and efficiency, the Cache Valley Transit District has implemented the following changes:

- **Installed updated bus stop signs on all routes**
 - Easier to read, and includes all routes servicing the stop
 - Scannable QR codes which link to remaining arrival times
 - Individual bus stop identification numbers to quickly identify locations
- **All routes now have a number and description**
 - For example, the former CVS Express is now "Route 12 (Nibley-Hyrum)"
- **Route 11 has been moved from Main Street to run along 100 E**
 - This improves service to businesses and residences on the east side of Main St.
- **Reformatted, enlarged maps**
 - Timetables for each route are now available
- **Partnered with Google to provide a Trip Planner**
 - Available on the CVTD website
 - Enter your start location and destination, and the Trip Planner will map your route

Water Pollution and Leaves

Fall is in the air and that means it's time to clean up those leaves in your yard. As you do, please remember to not put grass clippings, leaves, and yard debris in the street, storm drain, or ditch. Littering with your yard debris can cause problems for you and your water. Storm drains can clog, streets can flood, and water can become polluted. To avoid this, try using clippings and leaves as fertilizer or use a mulching lawn mower. Maybe try composting leaves and clippings, or call 435-716-9755 to sign up for a green waste container for \$4.00 per month (weekly pick up April - November). Please be considerate while cleaning up your yards this fall season. Thank you!

No Early AM Parking on Streets after November 15th!



We would like to remind everyone that starting **November 15th**, the winter parking ordinance (11-604) will go into effect. This means vehicles/trailers/RV's, etc., cannot be parked on city streets, curbs and shoulders between **1:00 am - 5:00 am** on any day. Please let your family and friends know, as well as your renters if you have them, as citations will be issued during these hours. Do not put your garbage/recycling out the night before if it looks like there will be snow during the night. During other hours, if it is snowing, or beginning to snow, we would appreciate you not parking on the streets so that our snow plows can keep your roads clean and safe for you and your family. Avoiding Fraud

The chances are very good that you may be targeted as a possible victim of fraud within the next year. As technology advances, it brings resources and information into our lives at a faster and faster rate. It also opens the doors for criminals to creatively attempt to defraud you. Let me highlight some of the most common scams that we are seeing:

- Using email to contact you about court summons, collection fees, fees for using a toll road, airline ticket information, package shipment/delivery problems, the list goes on. They may even use familiar company names as the sender, like Fed-Ex or American Airlines. In the email, they tell you to open the attachment to view details. **DO NOT** open the attachment. In reality, these companies would not contact you via email. They may send a notice in the mail, contact you via phone, or if they do send emails, they would not have you open an attachment. Someone is wanting to gain access to your information on your computer. Opening the attachment unleashes viruses and gives your information away.
- Using online advertising (KSL.com and/or Craigslist.org) to sell stolen items.
- Someone sees your advertisement on KSL.com and wants to buy the item. They want you to take a check for more than the amount of the asking purchase price and have you forward the balance to another party. Truth is, the check they are going to pay you with is fraudulent. They want you to deposit it in your account and then draw funds from your account to forward. You lose when the original check you deposited returns as a fake.
- Posing as a property owner wishing to rent apartments or townhouses. They advertise on Craigslist and communicate with prospective renters by using email. The truth is, they do not own the property and are trying to get prospective renters to send a deposit.
- A phone caller poses as a grandchild that is in trouble (arrested and in jail usually in Canada or Mexico) and needs money. They want you to send the money through Western Union or money gram. They also want you to keep it confidential. Truth is, your grandchild is just fine and is not in Canada or Mexico.
- Be wary of unsolicited calls from supposed product representatives, such as computer software providers. They may try to convince you of a problem your computer may have and ask you for a visa card number or bank account number to buy service. **STOP!** Hang up and look up a number for the company the caller reported to represent. Call them yourself and ask to confirm the first call. Chances are it is a scam. They just want your account information.

Doing the following may help ward off fraud:

- Check your credit card statements regularly to make sure you do not have charges made by someone else.
- Do a credit check to review what credit accounts are attached to your name.

These do not cover all the ways criminals try to defraud us so if you have questions about any activity that you think might be a fraud or scam, give the police department a call (435-753-7600). If they don't know for sure, then they will do some research to determine if it is legitimate.
