Urban Deer Update



During the month of December, North Logan's Animal Control Officer (ACO), Nolan Krebs, has been permitted by the Utah Department of Wildlife Resources to harvest the deer caught in traps within the City. Bucks that are caught will be released, however, the other deer will be made available to the public to use for meat, just as if that deer were taken in the deer hunt. Interested North Logan residents may request to be on a list to receive the deer and use the meat. A certificate will be provided authorizing possession of the deer by those requesting to do so. Once a deer is taken, the ACO will clean it out and the next person on the list will be notified when and where to come pick it up. The deer will still have the hide on it but otherwise, the person who gets the deer can have the meat processed however they would like to, just as if they had taken it in the wild. POLICE DEPARTMENT

Be Ready for Winter Travel! During this holiday season make sure to plan for plenty of time for your travels. Slow down and drive defensively. Remember that four wheel drive can give you better traction but if you are going too fast it will not help you stop any faster. On long trips, go prepared with extra water, blankets, food and first aid materials in your vehicle. This is the time of year when we are often asked, "What are the roads like in the canyon?" To check current road conditions anywhere in the state of Utah, including Cache County, call **511** from a Utah based phone or **866-511-UTAH** outside of Utah. You can also log onto the Utah Department of Transportation's Commuter Link website at: commuterlink.utah.gov. This website is maintained 24 hours a day, 7 days a week by the operators at the Traffic Operations Center. The website also features cameras with live video of Logan Canyon, Sardine Canyon, Hardware Ranch and a lot more. The fastest way to find out if SR 30 (Valley View Highway), Sardine Canyon or Logan Canyon have been closed due to weather is to follow the Cache Communication Center on Twitter at [Logan_Cache_911](https://twitter.com/Logan_Cache_911). Make this a safe and happy holiday for everyone.

STREETS DEPARTMENT

No Early AM Parking on Streets!

We would like to remind everyone that the winter parking ordinance (11-604) is now in effect. This means vehicles/trailers/RV's, etc., **cannot** be parked on city streets, curbs and shoulders between **1:00 am - 5:00 am** on any day. Please let your family and friends know, **as well as your renters if you have them**, as citations will be issued during these hours. During other hours, if it is snowing, or beginning to snow, we would appreciate you not parking on the streets so that our snow plows can keep your roads clean and safe for you and your family.



Illicit Discharge: "Any discharge to a municipal separate storm sewer that is not composed entirely of stormwater." This means that anything other than rain & snow melt are NOT allowed in the storm drain system. If you suspect illicit discharge, contact the City Offices.
